



ILS Law College believes in honing the skills required for being a successful lawyer. There are various other methods and techniques, beyond academic and class activities to impart variety of skills that could be applied by the law students in their careers and future life. Following is the report of various Advocacy Skill activities conducted in ILS Law College in the year 2017-18.

In 2017-18 a large group of students participated in various International, National and State Level Competitions and exposed to hard test of intelligence and skills.

More than 160 ILS students represented ILS Law College as speakers, researchers and participants in 63 Moot Court Competitions (including two competition outside India)--Trial Competitions, 2 Client Counseling Competitions, 1 Negotiation, 3 Mediation, 1 Judgment Deliberation Competitions, 1 Bill Analysis Competition

The teams won total prize money in various competitions of Rs. 2,67,000 and individual team members' won prizes worth Rs.31,500 making total of prize money Rs.2.98,500/-

Dr. Deepa Paturkar organised and co-ordinated these activities this year and guided teams participating in all competitions. Ms. Rajalaxmi Joshi and Isha Saxena organised the international law moots selections and team co-ordination and the Public International Law Competition. Dr. Deepa Paturkar coordinated the Novices' Moot-Court Competition. Dr Tejaswini Malagaonkar coordinated the Negotiation Challenge, Trial Advocacy Moot Court Competition and Client Counseling Competition. All teachers very willingly judged competitions and guided ILS teams. Library and administrative staff gave enthusiastic support.

Raghavendra Phadnis Moot Court Competition

Structure of the Competition: Raghavendra Phadnis Moot Court Competition is an annual Intra College Competition held to foster a spirit of mooting among students and serves as a selection round for National Level Moot Court Competitions. Students from second to final year of the Five-year Integrated Law Course and second to final year of the Three Year Post Graduate Law Course are eligible to participate. The Moot Court Society conducted a general orientation on mooting for the benefit of students.

The Competition was held in three rounds of preliminary, semi-finals and finals on 22nd July, 24th July and 5th August respectively with 449 participants arguing the preliminary rounds in 34 court rooms. Participants for the preliminary rounds were given an option to choose one among the 4 cases in relation to (i). Law of Torts, drafted by Suganshi Ropia and Harshita Garg (IV BA LLB) (ii). Arbitration, drafted by Yojit Pareek and Aayush Mitruka (Alumni, ILS Law College, Class of 2016) (iii). Constitutional Law, drafted by Chaitanya Reddy (IV BA LLB) and (iv). Intellectual Property Rights, drafted by Rahul Agarwal and Avni Sharma (V BSL LLB). The drafters of the problem conducted an elaborate orientation on their respective moot problems for the participants. The preliminary rounds were judged by advocates and ILS alumni.

The first two rankers from each court room from the preliminary rounds qualified to the semi-final rounds held on 24th July, 2017. 68 students argued in the semi-final rounds in six different courtrooms. The students argued the preliminary round's case for semi-final rounds. The rounds were judged by 12 judges, including academicians and practicing advocates.

12 students qualified to the final rounds. The students argued a case on the Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code, drafted by Zacarias Joseph (Associate, Khaitan & Co., Mumbai; alumnus, ILS Law College, class of 2015). The rounds were judged by Mr. Zacarias Joseph and Mr. Nilanjan Sinha, In-house counsel, Godrej India.

Structure of the Competition: The preliminary round of Public International Law Selection Round 2017-18 was conducted on 19/08/2017 and the final round was held on 21/08/2017.

The theme for this year's competition was 'Culling Of Wild Birds'. 39 teams with 3 members in each team from III, IV, and V B.A, LL.B. and II and III LL.B had participated in the competition. The preliminary round of the competition was judged by Dr. Sanjay Jain, Dr. Tejaswini Malegaonkar, Dr. Ananya Bibave, Ms. Swatee Yogessh, Ms. Vaishali Jadhav, Ms. Tejashree Vatharkar, Ms. Nalini Ambad, Ms. Shiwali Agarwal, Mr. Amit Khatu, Ms. Apurva Thakur, Ms. Priyanka Gogoi, Ms. Anvita Dinkar. 12 teams qualified for the final round. Structure of Competition: The Novice' Moot Court Competition was organised in three rounds on 21st February, 23rd February and 3rd March 2018 for the youngest batch of mooters from I BA LLB.

160 students participated in the preliminary round in 16 court rooms on 21st February, 2018, arguing, according to their choice, on four cases relating to (i) Law of Contract (ii) Intellectual Property Rights (iii) Law of Crimes and (iv) Law of Torts. The cases were drafted by- Junaid Lirani, V BSL LLB, and Satish Rai, Batch of 2017 (Contracts); Chaitanya Reddy, IV BA LLB (Intellectual Property Rights); Adithi Rao and Debayan Gangopadhyay, II BA LLB (Crimes); and Neha Deshmukh and Stephanie Nazareth, IV BA LLB (Law of Torts).

All the drafters conducted an orientation for the participants on 6thFebruary, 2018.

10th Judgment Writing Competition 2017-2018

Structure of the Competition: The 10th Judgment writing competition was organized on 23 December 2017 at the ILS Law College; in the memory of Judge Shri. P.N. Behere, a former District and Sessions Judge of Pune, and President of the Pune District Consumer Forum. Justice Mridula Bhatkar has encouraged us to holdthis competition. She supports throughout in conducting it. She has instituted prize in memory of Shri. P.N. Behere. The Competition was open for the students from the last two years of B.A. LL.B and LL.B. courses and also for LL.M. students. 43 students participated in the competition. It is a unique competition in terms of form and proceedings.

Before the Competition, Dr. Nilima Bhadbhade discussed with participants the outline of a judgment, its contents and its style, and also the law relating to Sale of goods, Arbitration and writing of an arbitral award.

Justice S. R. Sathe (Retd.) Judge Bombay High Court was the Chief Guest. He inaugurated the Competition, presided over the proceedings as arbitrator, and guided students about the subject matter and writing a judgment arbitral award. Hon'ble Mrs. Justice Mridula Bhatkar also was with the participants throughout the arbitral proceedings and gave tips about writing an award/judgment.

The case for the competition this year related to a dispute arising from a contract for sale of goods before an arbitral tribunal. The brief consisting of Claim petition, its reply, affidavits, other documents and correspondence through e-mails was circulated to participants four days before the Competition. This brief was based on imaginary facts inspired by the moot problem of the 11thWillem C Vis International Arbitration Moot Court Competition of 2004. It was drafted by Dr. Nilima Bhadbhade and Rajalaxmi Joshi, faculty at ILS Law College, Pune.

During the Competition Shri. B.R. Phatak, Advocate presented arguments for the Claimant. Shri. Amrut Joshi, Advocate presented argument for the Respondent. Justice S. R. Sathe (Retd.) was an arbitrator in the proceedings. All the participants had the opportunity to hear arguments of the parties, and to discuss their difficulties with the judge, before they proceeded to write the judgment with full access to the law library. Participants got to experience how Advocates argue, and with persuasion, besides the fact that arguments are not one sided activity, but rather a conversation or dialogue between the advocate and the judge. Teachers and 50 other students witnessed the proceedings.

Shri. V.K. Deshpande, Retired District Judge was present throughout the competition and also assessed the judgments. Justice Mridula Bhatkar has instituted prize in memory of Shri. P.N. Behere.

'Remembering S.P. Sathe 12^{th} Memorial National Moot Court Competition, 2018' was organized by ILS Law College, Pune from $8^{th} - 10^{th}$ March, 2018 in the memory of Professor S.P. Sathe, Principal, ILS Law College.

The moot proposition for this edition was drafted by Ms. Swatee Yogessh and Dr. Deepa Paturkar, faculties of ILS Law College. This year witnessed the participation of twenty-four teams from around the country.

DAY 1: The teams were welcomed to the college by Dr. Deepa Paturkar, Assistant Professor, ILS Law College Pune for the 12th National Moot Court Competition. She introduced the audience about the background and work profile of Mr. S. P. Sathe and also to this event which was organized as a tribute to him and his work to Indian jurisprudence and society. She thanked everyone for being a part of the moot court competition.

An orientation for the competition was held for enlightening the teams regarding the rules of the competition. This was followed by the draw of lots for the purposes of allotment of courtrooms and exchange of memorials. A session by SCC Online was conducted by Ms. Saranya Mishra, a student of IV B.A.,LL.B., who is also the campus representative of SCC Online. She explained to all the participants about the nuances of operating and accessing the SCC database. She also declared that as a part of the sponsorship for the event, each participant had been granted free access to SCC online for one month and the winners will be granted a subscription of SCC for one year.

After the successful accomplishment of the orientation session, the participants were then escorted to their respective accommodations for a long night of preparations for the preliminary rounds to be held the next day.

DAY 2: Preliminary and Quarter final rounds were conducted on 9th March, 2018. As per the draw of lots, teams were allotted courtrooms where they had to argue either on behalf of the Petitioners or the Respondent in one round and vice versa in the second round. The Judges for the preliminary rounds were briefed and were escorted to their respective courtrooms. The judges consisted of practicing advocates at the District as well as High Court.

Both the preliminary rounds were conducted smoothly and after the conclusion of both, 8 teams qualified for the Quarter-Finals. There was a draw of lots for the purposes of determining on whose behalf the team would argue in the quarter final round. The teams were seeded against each other. These teams went through to the Quarter-Final round based on the number of wins in the preliminary rounds as well as the total of speaker scores in both the preliminary rounds.

This was followed by a draw of lots for the Semi-Finals to be held on the next day. Thus, day 2 of the competition was successfully concluded.

DAY 3: The Semi-Finals round commenced at 9:00 a.m. on 10th March 2018. Four teams battled out for a spot in the final round of the competition. The competition was tough. Each team put forward their views in a manner most convincing to the judges. Teams encountered each other's arguments through case laws, relevant legal provisions and theories.

Out of all the twenty-four teams who had participated in the competition, two had managed to make it through to the Final-Round. CENTRE FOR INTERNATIONAL LAW

With the vision to impart the students with the necessary knowledge and skills to understand the tenets of International Law, the Centre for International Law of ILS Law College, Pune was formed in 2014.

Activities and Sessions Conducted:

- 1. India and the ICJ (March 1, 2018): This session was conducted by Shreya Mohapatra (III B.A., LL.B.), a Member of the Centre for International Law (CIL). She analyzed the relationship that India has had with the ICJ since they first came together, building towards a special reference to the recent case of Kulbhushan Jadhav, the representation of Indian judges at the ICJ along with the ICJ election process.
- 2. International Investment Law (February 26, 2018): Session was conducted by Tulika Gupta (V B.S.L., LL.B.), a member of the Centre for International Law about Investment Law in the international regime. Ms. Gupta began her presentation by dealing with the basics of investment law. Further, she dicussed Bilateral Investment Treaties and the different Rights and obligations they confer on States.
- 3. Research Project on Admissibility of Evidence in International Courts and Tribunals (From 13 February, 2018):Research Project organized in collaboration with Dr. Aniruddha Rajput, Member of the UN International Law Commission (2017-21), and alumnus of ILS Law College.He dealt with the applicability of the

- principles of law of evidence in international law and also, how the principles have evolved over the past, through judicial decisions and literature, and the need for continued development.
- 4. Basics of International Law (February 16, 2018): Session was conducted by Tulika Gupta (V B.S.L., LL.B.) and Ziauddin Sherkar (IV B.A., LL.B.). This session laid down the basics of international law such as, the distinction between public international law and private international law, sources of international law, application of the law, and its distinction from international relations. The speakers also discussed the relevant contemporary issues in international law, like the South China Sea dispute.
- 5. Careers in International Law (January 4, 2018): Session was conducted by Dr. Aniruddha Rajput, Member of the UN International Law Commission (2017-21). Dr. Rajput, an alumnus of ILS Law College, conducted the session emphasizing on the evolving nature of international law, Dr. Rajput explored career options in four principle ways Governance, International Organizations, Practice and Academia. It proved to be a very well received session.
- 6. EU Competition Law (August 28, 2017): Session was conducted by Soham Goswami (V B.S.L., LL.B.) regarding the various aspects of Competition Law in the European Union. Mr. Goswami highlighted the public aspect of antitrust law and also discussed the relevant treaties and cases to explain the involved principles and their application particularly in the European Union.
- 7. **Demo Moot** (August 16, 2017): Awani Kelkar (V B.S.L., LL.B.) demonstrated her arguments using 2016 Stetson problem. Krishnan Shakkottai (III LL.B.) and Tulika Gupta (V B.S.L., LL.B.) substantiated on the basics of mooting and the style differences between International Law and Domestic Law Moots. Further, few clips of the Jessup and FDI Finals were screened to help the students understand the essentials of effective oral advocacy skills.
- 8. Admissibility of Evidence in International Courts and Tribunals (From 13 February, 2018): The project involving several students from BSL and LLB, dealt with the principles of law of evidence in international law; how it has evolved over the past through judicial decisions and literature, and the need to develop them. The students are working under the guidance of Dr. Rajput on this topic that has been proposed for codification at the International Law Commission during its session in 2019.

Competitions organized: The committee organized the Fifth National Alternate Judgment Writing Competition, 2017-18. Dr. Sanjay Jain, Ms. Shiwali Agarwal and Mr. D.P. Kendrewere the facultycoordinators. The judgment passed by High Court of Bombay in the case of *Karan Dileep Nevatia v. State of Maharashtra*. MANU/MH/0001/2010, provided for the base of the competition.

The Competition was held in two rounds, written and oral. Nine entries were received from around the country for the written round, the result of which was announced on 05th March,2018. The written round was judged by D. Naresh Bodkhe, Associate Professor, Gokhale Institute of Economics and Politics, Pune.

After having shortlisted five students on the basis of their written submissions, students were invited to make oral presentations on 19th March, 2018. Dr. MC Patwardhan, Faculty, National Insurance Academy, Pune, was invited to judge the competition. On the day of the presentation, four presentations were made, as one of the participants did not turn up. A general feedback was given by Dr. Patwardhan to all the participants after all the presentations were made. Principal Joshi felicitated Dr. Patwardhan, which was followed by the announcement of results. The first prize, worth Rs. 10,000/- was awarded to Ms.Neelakshi Gupta, Symbiosis Law School, Pune, and the second prize, worth Rs. 8000/- was awarded to Mr.Deepanshu Shakargaye, Faculty of Law, Jamia Millia Islamia, New Delhi. The program was compered by Ms. Shiwali Agarwal. Towards the end of the ceremony, Dr. Sanjay Jain delivered the Vote of Thanks.

COMPETITION LAW CELL

Faculty Coordinator: Ms. Smita Sabne

The Competition Law Cell was convened in December 2016. The main goal of the Cell is to provide an opportunity for students to broaden their knowledge of competition law and to interact with other students who have a shared interest in the same. The cell familiarises students with competition law and allows students to cultivate their interest in competition law in an informal environment, without the pressure of being graded. It also expands students' advocacy skills by conducting demonstrations. The cell also conducts researchs leading to new insights and further the concept building of competition law.

- 1. Activities Conducted: Weekly sessions on Resale Price Maintenance ("RPM"). This session was conducted by Afreen Abbassi. The session covered issues like, the ingredients of establishing a violation of RPM under the Act and the intricate issues that the regulator faces while investigating a case of Vertical Anti-Competitive Agreements; Pro-Competitive effects, Adverse Appreciable Effect on Competition ("AAEC") and analysis of the Hyundai Order passed by the CCI.
- 2. Second weekly session was conducted by Divyanshu Sharma. This session concerned the Merger Control Regime in India. Divyanshu opened the discussion with defining combinations and the thresholds given under the act. He explained how assessing merger and acquisition under sections of the act is a futuristic exercise and discussed the various factors considered by the regulator while allowing a merger and discussed various instances where the regulator might be wary about the post-merger scenario considering which, it will make modifications as per which the combination will be approved.
- 3. The third session this year was a collaborative session of the international law Cell and the Competition law Cell. This session was conducted by Soham Goswami. Soham conducted the session on EU Competition law regime. He discussed article 101 to 110 of the Treaty For The Functioning Of The European Union ("TFEU"). Soham also discussed the issue of state aid and subsidies and how it effects the competition in the territory. Article 101 and 102 of the TFEU concern antitrust violation. The session entailed how the European Commission goes about investigating antitrust violations and discussion of various case laws exhibiting the robust characteristics of the Antitrust Regime in European Union.

- 4. The next weekly session was also a collaborative session of the ILS IPR Cell and Competition Law Cell. Both, came together to have session on the Interface of Intellectual Property Rights and Competition Law. The session saw a discussion on the purpose of competition law, areas of conflict between IP and Competition law, reconciliation of the objectives and understanding the jurisdictional issues of the CCI. The students also got to discuss the position of law in the backdrop of the cases like Microsoft v. Sun, HT Media v. Super Cassettes Industries and Ericsson v. CCI and Micromax.
- 5. The next weekly session was conducted by Afreen Abbassi on Big Data and Competition Law. The session encompassed the current issues concerning the development of Big Data and how Big Data gives an enterprise, an edge over their competitors. It entailed a discussion on how the regulator can step in to keep a check on entities that are in possession of Big Data and prevent them from using it to the detriment of the market.

Induction of new members: The Cell this year inducted new members. A moot problem was given to the interested students and they were expected to choose a side and send in their arguments favouring that side. Induction of new members was done on the basis of these arguments. The problem for assessment of students for the purpose of induction was drafted by Divyanshu Sharma. The main issues in the problem were:

- 1. Whether disparagement of fellow competitors is frowned upon under the competition act and,
- 2. The second issue concerned relevant turnover as a metric to penalise anticompetitive entities under Section 27 of the Act.

COMPETITIVE EXAMINATION FORUM

Faculty Coordinators: Dr. K.S. Waghmare, Assistant Professor

ILS Law College, since its inception, has produced many legal stalwarts who have left their mark in various fields and contributed to the development of the India. With increasing role of State in the welfare of the society, it is important to have efficient and sound setup of bureaucracy manned by dedicated, knowlegable and ethical officials. Keeping this in mind ILS Law College has initiated 'Competitive Examination Forum' to train the students to become competent officeirs who can assimilate legal knowledge with administrative acumen and serve the vanguard of the government machinery.

Following is the report of activites conducted by the Forum in 2017-18.

1. On 11/8/2017, Competitive Examination Cell, Law College, arranged discussion on how to prepare for competitive examinations, like UPSC. Mr. Prabhakar Narawane,

- a second year LL.B. student shared his experience of preparing and taking such competitive examinations. There was a positive response from the students.
- 2. On 18/8/2017 Mr. Siddharth Chapalgaokar, a second year LL.B. student, gave information about various competitive examinations conducted by UPSC, their eligibility criteria, and how to crack them.
- 3. On 1/9/2017 Mr. Ganesh Sirsat, alumnus of ILS Law College delivered lecture on "How to prepare for Judicial Magistrate First Class (JMFC) Exam" Around 200 students attended.
- 4. On 15/9/2017 Mr. D. P. Kendre, Assistant Professor, ILS Law College, delivered lecture on Panchayat Raj and amendment to Gram Panchayat Election, in furtherance of the 74th Constitutional Amendment.
- 5. Ten-Days Lecture Series for future Judges(JMFC) was organised by I.L.S. Law College in collaboration with Savitribai Phule Pune University. The lecture series was held from 29/01/2018 to 08/02/2018 at I.L.S Law College. Students from various law colleges of Pune participated. 115 students enrolled for this course. The inaugural session delivered by Mr. Bharskarrao Avhad (Advocate). Experienced faculty was invited to deliver the lectures, like Mr. Ajit Kulkarni Advocate, Dr. Nilima Bhadbhade, Mr. H.P. Deshmukh, Mr.Hrushikesh Ganu, Advocate, Dr. Deepa Paturkar, Dr. Sanjay Jain, and Dr. K.S. Waghmare.

On the last day, Principal, Vaijayanti Joshi, awarded certificates to all participants. Dr. K.S. Waghmare, and Mr. D.P. Kendre, Assistant Professors ILS Law College were Faculty Coordinators of this programme.

CORPORATE LAW CELL

The vision of the Corporate Law Cell for the academic year 2017-2018 was to familiarise the students with basic concepts of Corporate and Commercial Laws along with identifying and examining various issues under in today's corporate world. This year, the Cell intended to facilitate better comprehension of corporate laws among students through events, competitions etc., to supplement regular classroom learning experience.

Activities and Competitions Conducted

1. Extempore Moot Court Competition, Edition V

To identify and nourish advocacy skills among the students of ILS Law College especially in the arena of Corporate Laws, the Corporate Law Cell organised an Extempore Moot Court Competition on 29th August, 2017. The event attracted attention as it deviated from the traditional way of providing many days to students for working on a moot problem.

Saee Athalye, Sakshi Bumb, Kritika Shekhawat, Yash Bansal, Parmeet Batra, Amala George, Sharanya Shivaraman, Parvesh Baba, Madhura Bhandarkar, Riya Bramhe and Pragya Sharma drafted five moot problems for the competition based on Law of Contracts, Arbitration, Competition, Insurance and Securities Law while Mohith Gauri drafted the moot proposition for the finals on Competition Law.

The problems were released four hours before the preliminary round. There were 12 courtrooms comprising of 8-9 participants each. One student from every courtroom was to qualify for the final round. The finalists were expected to argue a new moot case, which was released one hour before the final round of the competition. The format required students to analyse and prepare their arguments within this limited time frame. The competition was met with an enthusiastic response and saw a participation of more than 80 students from various batches. The preliminary round of the competition was judged by V B.S.L.,LL.B. and III LL.B. students. The final round of the competition was judged by Adv. Anirudha Joshi, Founder/ Partner at Juris Armor, Advocates and Solicitors.

The winners of the competition were:

1st position- Ziauddin Sherkar (IV B.A.,LL.B.).

2nd position- Alefivah Shipchandler (IV B.A.,LL,B.).

3rd position- Vaibhav Chitlangia (III B.A.,LL.B.).

The cell tried to incentivize enthusiastic participation from the students by giving away books as prizes to the winners.

Books Given Away As Prizes Were-

- 1. Law relating to Arbitration and Conciliation by P.C Markanda.
- 2. Gower and Davies on Modern Principles of Company Law and Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code- 2016.
- 3. Concepts and Procedure by Jyoti Singh and Vishnu Shriram.

2. Regular Tuesday Sessions:

The Cell organised regular sessions every Tuesday. The sessions aimed to develop a comprehensive understanding of certain important concepts in different fields of corporate laws. The Cell endeavoured to cover one area of corporate law over two to three sessions every month. Every session saw an attendance of 20-25 students. Following fields of law were covered in the sessions-

a) Company Law: The Cell started its sessions this year by dealing with important concepts in company law. The first session for the semester covering the introduction to the basic concepts in Company Law was taken by Dhruv Tank

and Shreya Choudhary. The session aimed at acquainting the students with a brief overview of the concepts in Company Law and relevant landmark judgments on the same. The second session saw an in depth discussion on the Oppression and Mismanagement provisions in the Companies Act and relevant case laws, which was taken by Vivek Hegde and Nikhil Dubey.

- b) Securities Law: The sessions on Securities Law focussed on the introduction to Securities Markets, Intermediaries and Trading Mechanisms, and Capital Markets Instruments and the Securities Contracts and Regulation Act, 1956. The aforementioned topics were briefly covered by Yalini Ravi, Amala Maria George, Vivek Hegde and Srushti Shanbhag (III LL.B.) in over two sessions providing students with a deep insight of the law and its application.
- c) Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code: A session was conducted by Sharanya Shivaraman (IV B.A, LLB) on the Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code, 2016 in light of the Phadnis Finals Case. This session endeavoured to elucidate the basic concepts of the Code and explain the students how an IBC case could be argued before the Court. This session was followed by an enlightening guest lecture on the 'Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code and Company Law' by Ekta Chandan, an associate at J. Sagar Associates.
- d) Law on Arbitration: A session on the basics of Arbitration law was conducted to familiarise students with the concept of Alternate Dispute Resolution and a session on the basic provisions of the Act was taken by Vivek Hegde of (V B.S.L.,LL.B.). The session also saw a discussion on the Arbitrability Of Oppression and Mismanagement Claims.
 - Another session was conducted by Pragya Sharma (IV B.A.,LL.B.) on the Exit Rights of Minority Investors in lieu of choosing Arbitration as the way for Dispute Resolution. The session aimed at covering the basic concepts as well as at discussing the latest cases relating to the types of Exit Options, their enforcement in arbitration with a special focus on Put and Call option clauses.
- e) Deadly Internship Assignments: Following an inaugural session for the first year students, a workshop on deadly internship assignments was conducted. The aim of the workshop was to familiarise students with research techniques that could prove to be useful for them while working on internship assignments. Students were divided into six groups and each group was given a query based on varied commercial laws such as Contract Law, Company Law and Sale of Goods Act. Each group was required to give a presentation and prepare a note on the query given to them, identifying the issue, the provisions of law applicable and the legal position with respect to the issue. The time allotted for the exercise was 30 minutes

- 3. Colloquium on the Contemporary Issues in the Financial Sector:ILS Law College, Pune hosted this year's Colloquium on 'Contemporary Issues in Corporate and Competition Law' on 24th and 25th February, 2018 at the newly-built Conference Hall. This was the first time the college's Corporate and Competition Law Cells collaborated to jointly host an event at such a big scale. Speakers for the event were stalwarts from the legal fraternity. They included legal experts, senior advocates, members of specialized tribunals, and partners and associates of some of India's biggest law firms.
- **4.** Various Other Events And Sessions: The Cell in this academic year successfully organised various events and sessions which saw a good turnout and generated an appreciable interest in Corporate Laws.

CRIMINAL LAW CELL

Faculty Coordinators: Dr. Nitish Nawsagaray and Ms Isha Saxena.

Student Coordinators: Oorjaswi Goswami and Lavanyaa chopra (V B.S.L., LL.B.). The Criminal Law Cell endeavors to enhance the knowledge and skills of the students in the criminal justice system. The main aim of the cell is to analyze the procedural and substantive laws including the amendments. For this purpose Presentations, Discussions, Debates, Seminars pertaining to the topics and cases of major and minor acts of criminal law are organized by the cell. 52 students are members of this cell.

Activities conducted by the Cell during Academic year 2017-18:

- 1. The activities of the cell commenced with the first session on "The Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substance Act" on 25th July, 2017 with an inaugural session on 1st August, 2017 which discussed the agenda and activities planned for the year. It was followed by other sessions on Anti-Hijacking Laws, laws on Cruelty, Armed Forces Special Powers Act (AFSPA) followed by a debate on AFSPA and Section 161of CrPc: Scope of statements, Rape as Compoundable Offences and the Juvenile Justice Act, 2015.
- 2. Further, a quiz was conducted on the recent judgments on criminal law in collaboration with ILS Quiz Club on 23rd February, 2018.
- 3. The students of the Cell are working on the research topics with respect to the juvenile justice system in order to frame rules for the Juvenile Justice Act, 2015 based on the model rules of 2016.
- 4. The Students also engaged in the discussions and analysis of certain cases and acts like Coal-gate Scam, Arvind Kejriwal's Defamation Case, POCSO Act and the relevance of the Act of Sexual Harassment At Workplace.
- 5. A turncoat competition was organized by the cell on Gender Neutrality of section 497 of Indian Penal Code. The object of this exercise was to develop the skills of framing arguments both in favour and against the topic in each student, so that when they actually practice in the criminal courts at a later stage, they would turn out to be good prosecutors, defence lawyers and judges.
- 6. The students of the Cell are also contributing in the Project of "Decongestion of Yerwada Prison," an initiative of Justice Radhakrishnan Committee on Prison Reforms.

6th Justice V.M Tarkunde Memorial National Parliamentary Debate, 2018

The 6th Annual Justice V.M. Tarkunde Memorial National Parliamentary Debate was conducted from 12th to 14th January, 2018. The competition saw participation of 46 teams and 74 adjudicators, representing 27 institutions from all over India. The competition was divided in 5 preliminary rounds on the 12th and the 13th of January in which the teams debated on a variety of themes spanning Crime and Justice, International Relations, Feminism, Religion and Public Policy.

The adjudication core for this year's competition comprised of Osho Chhel (V B.A., LL.B., National Law School of India University), Tushar Kanakagiri (Ex-student of National Law School of India University, Bengaluru), Yash Sharma(Jawaharlal Nehru University), Sreeram VG(IV B.A.,-LL.B., Symbiosis Law School, Pune).

12 teams, with the highest number of wins and cumulative speaker scores qualified to the pre-quarter finals held on the 14th of January. The finals saw a Panel of 5 judges, chaired by Sarleen Kaur (Symbiosis Law School, Pune), Yash Sharma(JNU), Sreeram VG (Symbiosis Law School, Pune), Anushri (Christ University), Subham (Institute of Law, Nirma University). In a 3:2 split verdict, the cross team comprising Anish Ravishankar, Trishal Kumar and Advesh Jalan, a cross institutional team from NLSIU and Rashtriya Vidyalaya College of Engineering) on the side of Government, beat the team comprising Aniruddha Nigam, Siddharth Aatreya and Karan Dhalla from National Law School of India University, Bangalore (NLSIU), on the side of Opposition. The winners were awarded a cash prize of INR 27,000 and the runners-up were awarded INR 18,000. Additionally, Aniruddha Nigam from NLSIU was awarded Best Speaker with a cash prize of INR 7,000 and Sarleen Kaur from Symbiosis Law School, Pune, was awarded Best Adjudicator with a cash prize of INR 7,000. Anushri Rastogi from Christ University and Aastha Kapoor from Symbiosis Law School, Pune, shared the second best adjudicator award. Himanshu Patil was awarded the Best Internal Adjudicator with a cash prize of INR 3,000.

The sessions are held on every Thursday at 1:45 PM at Hall no 13, Laxmi building. The cell has a robust information system as every activity of the cell is notified to the students through its official e-mail, Facebook Page, WhatsApp Updates, notice boards and announcements.

Activities Conducted: The IPR Cell has organized a certificate course this year in the month of January. Besides this, the cell has started receiving requests for assistance from the teams representing college in National Moots based on IPR Law.

Sessions Conducted: The closing ceremony on March 1, 2018 was headed by Dr. Suvarna wherein the committee planned activities for the academic year to follow. A detailed account of the sessions throughout the year are as follows:

In the academic year 2017-18, the Legal Aid Centre started working from July 2017. The Centre had its meetings from Monday to Thursday from 12.30 p.m. to 3.00 p.m.

Activities Conducted

- I. Legal Aid and Literacy Camps: In this academic year, 8 legal literacy camps have been held both, in rural and urban areas. Details of the camps are as follows:-
- 1. Legal Aid and Literacy Camp Dehu Gaon, Taluka- Haveli, Dist.- Pune On 28th August, 2017: Under the guidance of Mr. D. P. Kendre and Dr. K.S. Waghmare, nearly 30 students of III B.A., LL.B. participated in this camp. This legal literacy camp was a collaborative effort of ILS Law College and the local administration of Dehu Gaon to emphasize the need for legal education and create awareness about the various remedies available under law for the aggrieved individuals. In order to create awareness among them, Dr. Deepa Paturkar conducted sessions on Right of Maintenance under Section 125 Cr.P.C, Rights of Consumer and Necessary Legal documents that every family should possess.

II. Legal Aid For Disadvantaged and Needy Section of Society: This year ILS Legal Aid Centre has collaborated with Kagad Kach Patra Kashtakari Panchayat and Green Tara Foundation for providing legal aid and services to their members. In this academic year, we have provided assistance for litigation in 3 matrimonial disputes initiated before the Family Court and one criminal case which is pending before Additional Sessions Court. Five matrimonial were settled amicably.

Kagad Kach Patra Kashtakari Panchayat – Total 21 cases were referred by the Centre. Most of the cases are related to family disputes.

Green Tara Foundation – 2 cases were referred to the Centre.

III. Legal Aid Clinics: We have our Legal Aid Clinics at Karve Institute, Deep Griha Tadiwala Road and Deep Griha Market Yard. These Clinics are attended

by faculty members and students. Approximately 100 cases were dealt with by the faculty and students.

Report of the Clinics

- 1. Deepgrah Society, Ambedkar Nagar, Marketyard: Dr. Deepa Paturkar coordinates the legal aid activities of this Clinic. She visits this Clinic on third Saturday of evey month. This year, we received 12 new cases out of which majority of the cases were pertaining to matrimonial disputes. We have amicably resolved 8 cases by counselling and sent 4 cases to the lawyers for further action.
- 2. Deepgrah Society Tadiwala Road, Pune: Mr. D.P. Kendre coordinates the legal aid activities of this Clinic. He visits this Clinic on fourth Saturday of evey month. He was accompanied by Ms. Sumedha Wagholikar twice in this year. Student volunteers of legal aid centre visit this clinic regularly for a research project on "Access to Justice". Around 20 cases have been settled in this year.
- 3. Family Counselling Centre M.S.W College of Karve Institute, Karve Nagar, Pune: Dr. K. S. Waghmare coordinates the legal aid activities of this Clinic. He visits this Clinic on Fourth Saturday of every month. Additionally, he visits this clinic as per the demand of the visitors to address their legal problems. He is also appointed as Committee Member of Karve Institute's Family Counselling Centre. Annual meeting of the committee was held on 15th February 2018.

IV. Other Activities

1. Participation in Lok Adalat : Lok Adalat organized by Pune District Legal Aid Authority Lok Adalat - 9th September 2017

Faculty Coordinator: Dr. Deepa Paturkar Pune District Legal Aid Authority organized Lok Adalat on 9th September 2017, where 25 students of IV B.A., LL.B. & III B.A., LL.B. participated.

Lok Adalat under legal Services authority Act 1987 is organized to reduce burden on judiciary by taking initiative to solve cases of insurance, motor vehicle Claims, Matrimonial Disputes, Labor and industrial disputes Property Disputes and so many taken in lok Adalat. The Lok Adalat was organized by Hon'ble Principal District Judge, Shri. S. M. Modak of Pune District Court and Shri. S. R. Ashturkar, Member Sectary Pune District Legal Aid authority.

Students participated as volunteers for the proceedings of the Lok Adalat. They were divided into groups such that each panelist gets required number of volunteers to coordinate with people, other panelists, and officers. Students were also required to assist helped litigants for coordination, guiding them to the right court, arranging and sequencing their documents, ensuring comprehension of compensation granted by the Lok Adalat.

Disputes worth more than 100 Cr INR were settled at this Lok Adalat. Nearly 100-150 Cr INR worth disputes were solved at this Lok Adalat.

The camp was under the Leadership of Hon'ble Principal District Judge Shri. S. M. Modak of Pune District Court, Shri. S. R. Ashturkar, Member Sectary Pune District Legal Aid authority, Mr. Hrishikesh Ganu, Advocate and Expert Doctors with their teams from Sancheti and Sasoon Hospital Pune. Students were divided into groups so that each panel gets required number of volunteers to coordinate with disabled people, doctors and officers. Approximately 500 patients were examined and certificates were distributed to the sufferer/ victims for claiming their insurance.

LIBRARY REPORT

The library plays a very vital role in the life of a reputed law school like ILS. Keeping in view the aims and ideals of the parent institution the library has developed itself into one of the richest and finest law libraries of India. Advanced technological support has turned it into a resourceful legal information center as well.

Like previous years, this year also the library witnessed a balanced growth of legal collection with focus on newly emerging areas like Bio-technology Law, International Trade, Maritime Law, Commercial Laws, Cyber Laws, etc

The total collection comprises around 51163 books and 12178 bound volumes of periodicals. Total addition to the collection from 01 Apr 2017 – 21 Mar 2018 is 1354, which includes 1255 books and 99 bound volumes.

Total number of periodicals subscribed is 76, out of which 57 are legal and socio-legal and 19 are general in nature.

Library is open throughout the academic year, from 9.30 am to 9.00 pm on all working days. Regular services provided by the library include Reference, Home Lending, Bibliography, and Photocopy as well as printing services on payment. Students of LL.M. are accorded Reference for their research. Students participating in Intercollegiate moot court competitions are benefitted by the rich collection of foreign books. Gymkhana membership gives access to literature section, which contains books in Marathi and English- both classics and modern.

The excellent library has stood by students not only in their fulfillment of curricular requirement, but also to win various co and extracurricular competitions at state and national levels, and even represent India at international competitions. With access to a highly resourceful information center, in the form of the library, they have an edge over their counterparts in many other institutions.

ILS has facilitated 53 computers for students, which provide access to well known Indian legal databases like AIR, Criminal Law Journal, SCC, Corporate Law Adviser, Lexis India, Manupatra, Taxsutra and renowned International databases— LexisNexis, West Law and Hein Online and Taxmann. We started subscribing Indian Law Review Journal both print and on-line version by Taylor and Francis. We are also a member of the N-LIST (National Library and Information Services Infrastructure of Scholarly Content) programme of INFLIBNET, This enables access to 7000 e-journals and over thirty-one lakh e-books published by renowned international publishers like LexisNexis, Oxford, Cambridge, Wilson, Thomson Reuter etc. Student ambassador from SCC online arranges orientation sessions for new users.

Dedicated 100 MBPS lease line ensures faster internet connectivity. More than 106 computers are working in LAN (Local Area Network) environment, Laxmi Building, all 3 floors of Saraswati building and Boys as well as the Girls' Hostel have been wi-fi

enabled and this facilitates students' access to the subscribed databases through their laptops much beyond the regular library hours.

To prevent theft and mutilation of books, Electronic Surveillance System has been installed. We have completed Bar-coding of around 80% library collection.

The Library can accommodate 250 students at a time. Separate reading space has been provided for teachers and research workers. It provides space for conducting seminars, orientation lectures, Placement interviews, Central Assessment Program, Centralised admissions of SPPU etc. Lift and ramps have been provided for the convenience of physically challenged people.

The infrastructure development, upgraded facilities and the academic ambience in the library have always provided great support to the academic community.

ILS CENTRE FOR ARBITRATION & MEDIATION (ILSCA) Director: Ms. Sathya Narayan.

The ILS Centre for Arbitration and Mediation (ILSCA) proposes to operate as a centre where facilities to conduct both Domestic and International Commercial Arbitrations can be made available. The centre also aims to facilitate institutional arbitration. ILSCA is in the process of making rules for holding Institutional Arbitration at the Centre. Currently, besides the Mumbai Centre for International Arbitration, Mumbai, there is no such arbitration centre in Maharashtra, which can cater to parties who can opt for Institutional Arbitration. It will be a joint effort between the Indian Law Society and the Domestic and International Business and Legal Communities.

ILS Institutional Arbitration will be a first-of-its-kind, attached to an educational institution, which imparts legal education. Another important objective of ILSCA is to provide training in ADR methods and other allied subjects on Arbitration.

- 1. Research and Documentation Projects
- 1.1 Women and Land Rights implemented in two phases

Phase I Duration: 9 months; October 2015 – June 2016

This ongoing research and advocacy project coupled with the component of capacity building of grassroots organizations on law and policy pertaining to women and property rights, which commenced in October 2015 completed its first phase in June 2016. This phase aimed at evolving a programmatic agenda for women and land rights in Maharashtra. The project is being carried out with the financial support of Swiss Aid India. Women's Studies Centre, partnered with the NGO – Society for Promotion of

Participatory Ecosystem Management (SOPPECOM). The core team to be working on this project included Dr. Jaya Sagade and Ms. Prasanna Invally from WSC, ILS Law College; Ms. Seema Kulkarni and Ms. Sneha Bhat from SOPPECOM; and Ms. Chaaya Datar, Ms. Ritu Diwan as special invitees.

Activities: Following the first phase of the project that focussed on reviewing the status of women and land rights in Maharashtra through secondary data and experiences from the field, the agenda for the second phase was decided, and following activities conducted in the year 2016-17

- A. State-level consultation 5th, 6th April 2016 in Pune This was the culmination of phase I in which about 40 grassroots activists and legal experts participated discussed issues faced in the different regions across Maharashtra, including legal issues; experiments that have been successful; and articulated suggestions for addressing these issues. The experiences of Working Group for Women and Land Ownership (WGWLO) a network of civil society organizations in Gujarat and the agenda of the national level network Mahila Kisan Adhikar Manch (MAKAAM), was also shared. The possibility for setting up a state level network was considered, and areas of research action and training identified, and an agenda for taking the effort forward was drawn out.
 - The following needs were identified and suggestions for taking the process forward were drawn out
 - i. Need to file PILs, Class actions, RTIs, for which the participant organizations needed legal advice and support
 - ii. Following key areas were identified for legal actions:
 - a. Scrapping of land fragmentation laws that are applicable in Maharashtra and Gujarat as they deter transfer of lands in the name of women.
 - b. Muslim personal law talks of only 1/3rd share for women. This needs to be amended and all groups who support gender justice should come together to demand such an amendment.
 - c. MIDC 1961 act should be amended to include compensation given for women from the land holding families whose land has been acquired
 - d. Transfer of rights to women from families eligible for transfer under the Kul kayda Act. Need for a class action to follow up on the pending tenancy cases in Sindhudurg and Ratnagiri
 - e. Need for ensuring that state lands are transferred in joint names of husbands and wives. RTI and a PIL can be filed
 - f. For Gairan land regularization there is a need for an overarching law and not only a GR

- g. Legal framework to protect the rights of the share croppers- can we draft something for that. The tenancy laws are stringent and hence farmers are not willing to have any record of share cropping.
- h. If 90% of lands are being cultivated by women then we should see how the law can be amended to transfer ownership to omen. Need for both dialogue and struggle.
- i. Need for supporting women in implementation of law. Can we think of an amendment? Curtail release deed processes etc
- iii. Legwork for the legal actions to be undertaken, were drawn out as follows:
 - a. Need for documentation of share croppers in the state. There is a concept note on land lease prepared by the Niti Ayog. This needs to be studied and commented upon.
 - b. Need to organize training and legal awareness workshops. Despite the laws and the GR state land is often given in the name of men. If concerned organisations who are aware of such cases can compile them. Law College and SOPPECOM can take on the responsibility of filing a PIL
 - c. Share all government GRs with the entire group.

B. Commencement of Phase II - December 2016 to January 2018

Phase II of duration 13 months has been designed on the basis of the needs that emerged and recommendations of civil society organizations working on women and land rights. It commenced from December 2016 and is in its preparatory stage. Some of the activities planned are as follows:

- A three day state Level workshop on perspective building and legal awareness on women and land rights in order to create awareness amongst the lead karyakartas and the organizational leadership to take the issue forward
- ii. Three day legal awareness of staff of HMF, Manavlok and MASUM and a few other interested organisations from Marathwada who had shown interest in the regional meetings of phase I
- iii. Four one day workshops on Perspective building and legal training of local government officials in the Martahwada region of Maharashtra.
- iv. Conduct a participatory research in order to create a data base on the extent of claims made by women for private and public property, to understand the extent of release deeds in the field area specifically in the case of Hindu and Muslim personal laws, and create the training material for the staff of the participating NGOs

1.2 Developing User Manuals for various cadres of personnel appointed under the Protection of Women from Domestic Violence Act, 2005. (PWDVA)

Project duration: November 2016 to July 2018: The need for user manuals arose out the various training sessions on the Act that the Women's Studies Centre had conducted in the past with judicial officers, protection officers, police, lawyers, medical professionals and counsellors. Manuals for each of these stakeholders are in the making. In order to emphasize on the gender sensitive perspective of the PWDVA, a separate section on 'Gender and Domestic Violence' would be part of each of these manuals. This project is supported by SwissAid India.

WSC has collaborated with NGOs and individuals that have expertise in the field to author the manuals viz: CEHAT (medical professionals), TISS (Police) and Sahyog (lawyers), and Mr. Milind Chavan (gender expert). WSC would be authoring the manuals for judges, protection officers and counsellors. The core faculty for the project are Dr. Jaya Sagade and Ms. Prasanna Invally.

The following activities were conducted during the year 2017-18 under this project:

- 1.2.1 Meetings with authors of the Manuals:
 - a. One day centralized meeting with the authors of the Manuals 17th Jan 2017: The purpose of the consultation was to discuss the broad style, methodology and content. A team of six authors participated. It was emphasized that manuals should aim at helping a stakeholder in using one's authority, implementing one's duty and using PWDVA provisions effectively and gender-sensitively. In other words it ought to be application based.
 - The team discussed about how the manuals would be different from the existing ones, the nature of the content and the style, the language style to be used in the manual, the process to be followed during manual preparation the financial resources available for it, and the time-line of various activities.
 - The group also brainstormed on what the manual on Gender and DV, which would be a common part across all manuals should contain.
 - The report of the meeting was shared with all authors.
 - b. One-on-one meetings with authors:
 - The core faculty for the project has responded to authors' queries, assisted in building an outline in case of Gender and DV manual, and provided inputs on the manual content to bring the focus on PWDVA. The meetings and communication on manual drafts with the respective authors was through email, phone and meetings in person
- 1.2.2 Collective consultation of stakeholders across Maharashtra 8th April 2017:

Representatives of the various stakeholders under the PWDVA were invited. The participants – in all 32 individuals - included protection officers (and concerned DWCD officers), police officers, medical officers, lawyers, NGO representatives working on issues of gender and DV, and authors of the various manuals. The consultation was held in the conference hall of ILS Law College.

The purpose of the consultation was to explore the needs, identify knowledge gaps, explore issues in coordinated effort of stakeholders, and their difficulties that need to be addressed in the manuals. The author of each manual made a presentation of the broad content, followed by a discussion. They sought information and enquired about the content and style that need to be included.

Presentations by authors and discussions that followed - in brief:

Ms. Anuradha Kapoor made the first presentation on the theme Gender and DV. The group suggested the emphasis should be laid more on gender, patriarchy, gender-based violence and DV, rather than on the emergence of PWDVA. Use of examples, illustrations, quizzes – such as "How gendered are you?" should be included, and the content made interesting.

Dr. Jaya Sagade then made a presentation on issues that she would address in the Manual for judges. The group discussed that emphasis was to be laid on proactive role that judges can play at every stage of the proceedings, keeping in mind the spirit of the Act that calls for protection from all forms of violence, quick reliefs and use of interim orders, calling for services of multiple providers and protection officers and experts, etc. Illustrations of best practices and case law could add flavour to the manual.

Ms. Rama Sarode, (Advocate) presented on the Manual for Lawyers. Care that lawyers should take to ensure that the law is not diluted detailing out the violent incidents and its consequences in the application, advocacy issues such as inefficiency of free legal aid from the LSA and, certain tips in using legal provisions in the best interests of the DV survivor were discussed.

Ms. Medha Deo, TISS, Mumbai presented on the manual for police officers. The group discussed about how the DIR copied be maintained / used and make it a police record, their role in implementation of orders, in supporting the PO, the GRs that have been passed in the context of the role of police under PWDVA, etc.

Ms. Prasanna Invally presented the outline of the Manual for Protection Officers and raised certain questions related to practice and difficulties faced by them. She sought information on how POs addressed these difficulties and enquired about how provisions such as safety plan were used. It emerged that use of FAQs in the manual at every stage would make it practical.

Ms. Padma Deostahli, CEHAT, Mumbai, presented on the role of medical officers in dealing sensitively with a DV survivor, the protocols that they can follow, and their duties and functions under PWDVA about which they have generally no information.

Ms. Prasanna Invally, presented on the role of counsellors as 'Service Providers' under PWDVA. Counsellors, who are part of Service Providers, have a limited role, and it is advisable not to get into too many technical details on counselling, the participants suggested. Also it was suggested, that an overall role of service providers be covered in the manual. Participants also suggested that material for DV survivors is also direly required, and the project holders may consider preparing such material.

The consultation ended on a note that the draft manuals so prepared would be shared with respective stakeholders for the purpose of testing, and a request to cooperate with the authors.

2. Conducting courses / training projects

2.1 "Enhancing quality of counselling services for domestic violence survivors" – phase II

Duration: May 2016 to December 2018

This training project, specially designed for rural-based counsellors, was implemented in two phases. The year-long first phase which began in June 2015 concluded in May 2016. The second phase of 18 months duration began in May 2016 and is due to conclude in December 2018. 18 counsellors from 9 NGOs from the regions of Marathwada, Ratnagiri, and Pune district went through the training. SwissAid India financially supported both the phases of this training project.

The core training team designed the entire training course. It included – Dr. Shirsha Sathe (psychologist and Dr. Kaustubh Joag (psychiatrist) who took the lead in highlighting the psychological and mental health aspects in counselling practice; and Dr. Jaya Sagade (law professor) and Prasanna Invally (social worker) in bringing in the legal and social components into the training design. Dr. Shrisha Sathe's inputs have been particularly valuable as they are based on her Ph.D. thesis that is underway.

The training project used the methodology of contact training through workshops; field training through visits, tele and skype conferencing, homework assignments and one-on-one supervision.

The following were the activities conducted under Phase II of the project in the year 2017-18.

b. Field visits – for field training:

The training team made two field visits to each seven participating NGOs. Field visits served the following purpose:

- Revision of classroom training and its application in various cases that they handle
- Overview of counselling process and intervention in the cases they handle (case presentations by trainees)
- Provide inputs on using the framework of "cause -consequence response to DV" in cases they handle
- Improvement of counselling skills

The key issues discussed during field visits included:

- Power dynamics in relationships
- Symptoms of mental disorders
- Issues in dealing with addiction
- Identifying defenses

Issues to be address in counselling at the level of value, motivation and skill level that hamper the intimate relationship

The field training helped trainees learn the following -

- How 'ideal self' as defined by patriarchal models hamper change process
- Using skills of questioning, probing, empathizing (also with perpetrator)
- Mobilizing resources, self-care, motivating the counselee for self-safety
- Preparing action plan and keeping records
 - c. Field supervision: A field supervisor Ms. Shailaja Aralkar was specially appointed to visit the trainees of the various NGOs periodically, seek feedback, facilitate handhold support, collect relevant documents etc., and facilitate communication between the trainees and the trainers. Communication channel between the trainees of the respective field organizations and training team sustained throughout the project. With the help of the field supervisor professional and learning issues of each trainee were identified and addressed. Potential strengths of each trainee while working in the field were also identified and appreciated.
 - **d. Supervised counselling:** Through the year one-on-one supervision and guidance in dealing with counselling issues and legal issues was provided to all trainees, through teleconferencing, during field visits of training team and centralized workshops. The key issues addressed were –

Breaking ice with perpetrator,

Suicide and depression

Mental health status examination

Suspicion

Negotiating for legal rights (settlements)

Safety planning

Dealing with children/ child-related issues

Dealing with anger grief (loss),

Counselling skills of empathy and using principle of acceptance,

Counselling the perpetrator

Joint counselling skills

Supervision enhanced the trainees' skills to identify and follow steps in the counselling process and enhanced their ability to apply information (theory) to practice.

- e. Preparation and publication of manual on Counselling, and dissemination event: The need-based training inputs have been captured in "प्रवास सक्षमतेकडे" A manual for counsellors in Marathi. It consists of five topics viz –
- i. Domestic Violence and its Dynamics
- ii. Domestic Violence and Mental Health

- iii. Counselling in Domestic Violence situations
- iv. Clinical intervention planning and techniques
- v. Domestic Violence and law
 Formats for writing case records of counselling are also provided in the last
 chapter.

200 copies of the Manual were printed and published by WSC.

The publication was released in the release and dissemination event held on 27th Dec 2017 at the hands of Ms. Vijaya Rahatkar, chairperson of the Maharashtra State Commission for Women (MSCW). She spoke about the seriousness of the domestic violence issue and highly appreciated the efforts of WSC. She also expressed that MSCW would like to endorse it, print more copies for distributing it to all those government-run and government aided organization that provide support, guidance and counselling to domestic violence survivors.

72 participants attended the dissemination event that was held in ILS Law College. They included all trainees and their organizational heads, representatives from the Maharashtra Women and Child Development, Protection Officers, practicing counsellors from Police department and their special cells, free-lance counsellors and those from NGOs, lawyers, social activists and psychologists.

The trainees shared their learnings and Smt. Vidya Bal and Dr. Shyamala Vanarase were the key speakers who spoke in the issue of domestic violence and the manual contents.

During this event, certificate was awarded to each trainee counsellor, which has a special mention of his or her respective unique achievements and strengths. This is in appreciation of their effort and to boost the confidence to such rural-based counsellors, who otherwise do not get opportunities for specialized training.

3. Participation in Seminars/ Conferences

3.1 Meeting of AMAN - the national level network against domestic violence Held on 1st to 3rd May 2017, in Bangalore.

WSC team participated in the meeting which largely discussed challenges faced in stopping violence and in implementation of PWDVA. Sec 498A that is being diluted was one of the major concerns expressed, for which advocacy is required. Besides, non-appointment of sufficient number of protection officers and allocating additional to them duties in various states, complete ignorance about role of medical officers in addressing DV, lack of coordination among stakeholders were also voiced. Whether use of government schemes – such as victim compensation scheme (that is applicable across the country) can be extended to DV survivors, working with District Legal Services authority, and raising awareness and advocating the use of other existing schemes, was also discussed. The grassroots practitioners shared positive experiences in addressing

DV (such as support of village level panchayat samiti, support groups, etc.) and best practices that were shared were insightful. Parliamentary and budget advocacy and media campaign were suggested as being the need of the day and the purpose of an AMAN campaign in future.

3.2 Publication of "प्रवास सक्षमतेकडे" Manual by MSCW: On International Women's Day — 8th March 2018, the Maharashtra State Commission for Women after endorsing the Manual for counsellors "प्रवास सक्षमतेकडे" that WSC prepared, was released. 1000 copies have been printed and set to be distributed among government-run and aided organizations who work with domestic violence survivors and their issues.

The WSC team along with the key trainer Dr. Shirisha Sathe, attended the release programme.

Aims of the Centre:

- 1. To promote rights based approach to mental health policy and legislation
- 2. To undertake and promote research in the area of mental health policy and legislation
- 3. Increase awareness about mental health policy and legislation issues amongst the stakeholders including the general public.
- 4. Advocate for mental health policy and legislation which protects and promotes the rights of persons with mental disorders.
- 5. Sensitise the community, service providers and stakeholders to protecting and promoting the rights of persons with mental disorders.

To achieve these aims the Centre conducts activities such as Teaching and Training, Legal Aid and Advice, Specialist Technical Assistance, Workshops, and Projects.

Following is a list of some projects undertaken by the Centre for Mental Health Law and Policy

CMHLP SPIRIT project: Indian Law Society's Centre for Mental Health Law & Policy has started implementing a suicide prevention project in Mahesana district of Gujarat. It is being supported by the Department of Health and Family Welfare, Government of Gujarat, and is fully funded by the National Institute of Mental Health of the National Institutes of Health (United States). The project will be implemented in collaboration with Trimbos Institute (The Netherlands); SNEHA – Suicide Prevention Centre, Chennai; Gujarat Institute for Mental Health, Hospital for Mental Health Ahmedabad; and the Bangladesh Center for Communication Programs (Bangladesh).

INCLUDE: Under Indian Law Society's INCLUDE collaboration with Vrije Universiteit, Amsterdam (The Netherlands), Renuka Nardodkar was awarded doctoral degree in November, 2017. Topic of her PhD dissertation was Structural Discrimination Against Persons with Mental Illness. Currently she is working for regulatory affairs and data management of Suicide Prevention and Implementation Research Initiative (SPIRIT) project funded by National Institutes of Health.

Atmiyata- Atmiyata Gujarat is a low cost and high impact community based project. The project aims at improving access to mental health and social care for people in rural parts of Gujarat. The project try to build capacity of community volunteers which will help in sustainability. Atmiyata Gujarat has started in November 2016 but large amount of work has happened since April 2017. Till date we have covered 250 villages, trained 400 volunteers and reached out to 500 beneficiaries. The project is funded by Grand Challenges Canada, Canada along with Mariwala health Initiative, Mumbai.

International Diploma in Mental Health, Human Rights & Law

10 Year Celebration: The International Diploma is run by Indian Law Society in collaboration with World Health Organization (WHO). Offered as a distance-learning program to accommodate working professionals across the globe, this diploma guides and equips change-makers to integrate human rights into practice. The Diploma includes both residential and distance learning. The residential was conducted from 22nd October 2018 to 3rd November 2018. Dr. Soumitra Pathare and Dr. Jaya Sagade worked as Co-Coordinators for the Diploma.

Objectives of Diploma:

The International Diploma is instrumental in creating change-makers across the world who to initiated substantial transformation in promoting the rights of persons with psychosocial and/or intellectual disability in their respective countries. The International Diploma equips graduates with specific learning as well as transferable skills, including:

- 1. Integrate international human rights concepts into your practice
- 2. Explain the elements of mental health service planning using World Health Organization tools
- 3. Identify whether country laws are consistent with international human rights and best practices
- 4. Understand how stigma against people with mental disabilities has resulted in social exclusion and what can be done about it
- 5. Use research evidence to demonstrate human rights violations and develop recommendations to policy-makers, by completing a research project
- 6. Develop a campaign, write policy papers, draft press releases, and use other advocacy techniques to call for changes.
 - Faculty members with various expertise and experience, from various countries and settings allow for a diverse input and learning experience into the course content.

The International Diploma in Mental Health, Human Rights, and Law offered a fee waiver program for students for the academic year 2017-18. The purpose of this fee waiver was to reduce economic barriers and enable deserving candidates to undertake the International Diploma program, as part of its 10th year anniversary.

Over the past 10 years, the International Diploma produced 101 graduates from countries including: Afghanistan, Argentine, Barbados, Belarus, Brazil, Chile, Czech Republic, Egypt, Fiji, Georgia, Germany, Canada, Greece, Hungary, India, Jamaica, Jordan, Latvia, Libya, Lithuania, Malaysia, Nigeria, Pakistan, Palestine, Papua New Guinea, Romania, Slovak Republic, Solomon Islands, South Korea, Spain, Sudan, Suriname, UK, Ukraine, USA, and Zambia, including individuals from various professional backgrounds including persons with lived experience/ mental health care users.

17 students enrolled for the Diploma in the academic year 2017-18 from various countries across the world.

Resource persons for the Diploma were - Ms Charlene Sunkel- Programme Manager: Advocacy & Development, SA Federation for Mental Health; Mr. Oliver Lewis; Dr. Yitzhak Levav: Ministry of Health; Dr. Michelle Funk, Coordinator, Mental Health Policy and Service Development (MHP) Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse, World Health Organization; Dr. Rahul Shidhaye: Research Scientist and Adjunct Assistant Professor, Public Health Foundation of India, Bhopal; Dr. Surinder Jaiswal, Professor, TISS, Mumbai; Ms. Mrinalini Ravi and Ms Kamala Eswaran, The Banyan (Mental Health NGO), Chennai. The course was taught by a faculty of renowned international experts who have been actively involved in WHO's work to improve the human rights situation for people with mental disabilities.

CONFERENCES/ SEMINARS COLLOQUIUM 3.0 ON CONTEMPORARY ISSUES IN CORPORATE AND COMPETITION LAW

Faculty Coordinator: Ms. Smita Sabne & Ms Swatee Yogessh

ILS Law College, Pune hosted this year's Colloquium on 'Contemporary Issues in Corporate and Competition Law' on 24th and 25th February, 2018 at the newly-built Conference Hall. This was the first time the college's Corporate and Competition Law Cells collaborated to jointly host an event at such a big scale. Speakers for the event were stalwarts from the legal fraternity. They included legal experts, senior advocates, members of specialized tribunals, and partners and associates of some of India's biggest law firms.

First day of the Colloquium dealt with contemporary issues affecting the field of corporate law. It was divided into three sessions, which included talk by speakers, a panel discussion and key-note addresses.

Day1 : Session I:_Decoding the SEBI Regulations on Real Estate Investment Trusts

Speaker: Mr. Arun Jerome, Senior Associate, Shardul Amarchand Mangaldas

This session commenced with Shreya Choudhary [III B.A. LL.B.] introducing the speaker and giving a basic idea about the topic. Mr. Jerome used a presentation to explain the niceties of real estate investment trusts (REITs) and the law applicable to them in India. He began by pointing out key characteristics of REITs and features that set them apart from other financial entities and discussed it in the light of SEBI (Real Estate Investment Trust) Regulations, 2014, he eventually went on to make a case for REITs in India.

The session concluded with a question- answer session.

Session II: Restrictions on the Layering of Subsidiaries

Speakers: Mr. Ashish Ahuja, Partner, Wadia Ghandy & Co.

Mr. Vinayak Khanwalkar, Partner, Kanj & Associates

Ms. Purti Minawala, Associate, Crawford Bailey & Co.

Ms. Minawala, acting as the moderator, opened up the debate by explaining how newly-introduced measures of the government had given rise to discussions on the issue of layering of subsidiaries. She pointed out that Section 2(87) authorizes the government to cap the number of subsidiaries companies can have, which has been done by the notification of the Companies (Restrictions on Number of Layers) Rules, 2017 on 20th September last year. Mr. Khanwalkar took over the podium thereafter to argue in favor of such restrictions. Using anecdotes and his practical experience as a Company

Secretary, he highlighted several real-life examples of corporate mis-governance to support the government in preventing companies from creating several subsidiaries.

Taking up the contrary view in this debate was Mr. Ahuja, whose arguments basically explained why restrictions imposed on layering of subsidiaries to curb the menace of money laundering was a classic example of problem-solution mismatch. Despite terming black money, FEMA violations and money laundering as problems that need to be addressed, Mr. Ahuja explained that outright restrictions on companies from creating subsidiaries will not resolve anything.

Session III: Smart Contracts & Crypto-Currencies: The Legal Conundrum posed by Blockchain Technology

Speaker: Mr. Arvind Ravindranath, Associate, Nishith Desai Associates

Mr. Ravindranath began by giving a brief introduction on what block chain technology really is. He used a presentation to get down to the root of crypto currencies and smart contracts by pointing out their practical applications. He made out a strong case by advocating in support of block chain technology and smart contracts, but ruled out the existence of crypto currencies in the longer run.

Day 2: Session I: Keynote Address

Mr. Ramji Srinivasan, Senior Advocate, Supreme Court of India

The second day of the Colloquium began with a keynote address by senior advocate Ramji Srinivasan. Mr. Srinivasan spoke on the 'The Framework of Competition Law in India'. He began by explaining the need for competition law. He delved into the history of the Act by explaining the fallacies of the Monopolies and Restrictive Trade Practices Act and the reasons for Parliament enforcing the Competition Act 2002. He went on to explain the meaning and interpretation of the Section 3 and Section 4 prohibitions and how restraints were classified under the Act. Mr. Srinivasan was aided by his fellow resource persons while making the presentation.

Session II: The Legislative and Regulatory Framework

Moderator: Dr. Geeta Gouri, former Member, Competition Commission

Panelists: Mr. Ramji Srinivasan (Senior Advocate, Supreme Court of India),

Mr. Rajshekhar Rao (Advocate, Delhi High Court), Mr. Ratneshwar Prasad (former Member, Competition Commission)

The first session began with a presentation made by Dr. Gouri detailing the relationship between economics and competition law. She drew upon her experiences as an economist working in regulatory policy. Dr. Gouri spoke at length about the expansion of current markets and the future markets, the new sectors and the challenges presented before the competition regulator in regulating agencies like the National Stock Exchange (which has no quantifiable turnover). Mr. Srinivasan brought in the legal aspects of the issue and highlighted the difficulties the Commission faced due to the interpretation of the Competition Act. Mr. Rao further elaborated upon the same and

discussed his experiences before the National Company Law Appellate Tribunal, and also detailed the Government's struggle with introducing industry regulations. Mr. Ratneshwar Prasad briefly explained the gamut of financial and regulatory laws and how they jointly regulated competition in India.

Session II - Collective Dominance and Uncertainty Surrounding Single Economic Entity Doctrine

Panelists: Naval Chopra, Dhruv Rajain, Saumya Hariharan

The second session dealt with analyzing the scope of collective dominance regime within the present framework of the Competition Act. The session was opened by panelist Naval Chopra who presented his views on the current regime of competition law in India.

Mr. Ratneshwar Prasad presented his views on the topic where he maintained that the concept of collective dominance is very much present in the current scheme of the Act. In the opinion of Mr. Prasad, placing reliance on his dissenting order in *Neeraj Malhotra v. Deutsche Post Bank Home Finance (2010)*, such a concept can be found under Sec.3 of the Act. The classes of parties to an agreement dealt with by section 3(3) are; enterprises, associations of enterprises; persons or associations of persons and they could act in any combination.

The audience was then addressed by panelist Ms. Hariharan. She spoke about the notification of March 04, 2016, revising the merger control regime in India and its impact on the industry. She also presented her views on the concept of "single economic entity" and the ambiguity prevailing around it.

Lastly, Mr. Rajain addressed the participants by sharing his opinion on "Single Economic Entity" concept. He drew the attention of the participants to numerous cases such as *Exclusive Motors Pvt. Ltd. v. Automobili Lamborghini, Shamsher Kataria v. Honda, et al.*, to explain the doctrine.

The session was then followed by a short Q&A from the participants and was concluded.

Session III: Resolution of Abuse of Dominance Cases by Settlement

Moderator: Mr. GR Bhatia

Panelists: Mr. Dhruv Rajain, Mr. Ratneshwar Prasad

This session was opened by the moderator, Mr. Bhatia who commenced by taking about his views on the current competition law regime in India. The participants of the colloquium were then addressed by Mr. Rajain, who presented statistics to show that indeed abuse of dominance cases should be resolved by settlement

Mr. Prasad then opined on the powers of CCI to pass an order in the nature of a consent decree pursuant to the residuary clause under § 27(g). However, he suggested that for resolution of abuse of dominance cases by settlement to work properly, CCI ought to

introduce proper regulations to govern the procedure in which such settlement should take place. The rest of the panel agreed to this suggestion.

From the discussion among the panelists it appeared that all three panelists agreed that Indian Competition Law regime is extremely far from resolution of abuse of dominance cases by settlement.

The session was concluded by a Q&A session.

ONE DAY NATIONAL CONFERENCE ON "CHANGING DIMENSIONS IN MEDIA LAWS"

ILS Law College, Pune organized a One-Day National Conference on the theme of "Changing Dimensions In Media Laws" on the 10th February, 2018. The conference experienced a participation of about 270 attendees from within and outside Pune inclusive of students and professionals.

The theme was divided into 3 sessions, each dealing with the interface of Media Laws with other Laws. The first session was on "Censorship and Public Policy" which was chaired by Principal Vaijayanti Joshi and was paneled by 3 esteemed speakers. First speaker Mr. Sudhir Makkar, Sr. Advocate, Delhi High Court, spoke about how media aids in mobilizing public's opinion through Media Trials, Yellow Journalism and also explained the scope of "expression" under Article 19 of the Indian Constitution. Mr. Ravi Suryavanshi, Partner at Naik and Naik Co., Bombay enlightened the audience about how censorship works in the film industry and also covered censorship related issues with other forms of media like books, advertisements, etc. The last speaker of the session was Dr. Nitish Nawsagaray, Faculty, ILS Law College. He opined on how the censor board is not a mere body to grant certificates for movies but acts as a moral police and strongly advocated the removal of it as a censoring body. He strongly condemned an independent body to control what people can watch or not.

The Second session was on "Unique IPR in Media" chaired by Dr. Sita Bhatia, Faculty, ILS Law College. On the panel, was Mr. Ravi Suryavanshi again who gave his insight into "Movie Title Infringements and Bollywood Contracts" and shared his experiences having represented a lot of Bollywood Production houses for various Bollywood movies. He enlightened the participants by giving examples like Nishabd and Nishabbd, Veeray ki Wedding and Veeray Di Wedding, etc. The second speaker was Dr. Sanjeeth Hegde, Senior Partner, Banana IP Counsels, Bangalore. He spoke on "Digital Content Control" and covered all the aspects related to the topics while focusing on famous apps and websites like Netflix, Shazam, Saavn, etc.

The last session was on "Media and Sports", chaired by Dr. Tejasvini Malegaonkar, Faculty, ILS Law College. The session had two speakers; Mr. Rohan Bhammar, Legal

Manager, IMG Reliance who talked about the "Privacy Rights of Sportspersons" citing examples of Cricket, Football, etc. He explained the concept and difference between Privacy Rights of Sportsperson and their publicity rights. The methods of brand endoresement and conflicts therein were also discussed. The last speaker of the conference was Ms. Divvya Verma, Consultant, Bharucha and Partners, Mumbai. She spoke on the topic of "Broadcating Rights of Sports Channels". She discussed the various aspects of owning broadcasting rights, their sale and liabilities arising therein. Monitoring of broadcasting channels in a country as well as cross-country also were the topics of discussion.

The seminar saw interactive discussion on the various challenged faced by men and women in various facets of life including homes, workplaces, media and the society. This seminar saw participation of over 60 students and professionals from across the country.

SESSION 1 Gender Sensitization : The first session was on the topic Gender Sensitization and was chaired by Dr. Tejaswini Malegaonkar. Assistant Professor, ILS Law College, Pune. The resource person for the session was Ms. Devika Singh, Advocate, New Delhi.

The session began with paper presentation by Ms. Aditi Khobragade, student of ILS Law College on the topic of "Gender Stereotyping in Career Building" The resource person, Ms. Devika Singh addressed the gathering about the difference between sex and gender and related societal stereotypes. 
