## Activities and Student Involvement

In 2015-16 a large group of students participated in various International, National and State Level Competitions and exposed to hard test of intelligence and skills.

More than **175** ILS students represented ILS Law College as speakers, researchers and participants in **54** Moot Court Competitions (including two competition outside India) **3** Trial Competitions, **2** Client Counseling Competitions, **2** Negotiation, 1Drafting Competition, **1** Judgment Deliberation Competitions, **1** Legal research Paper Competition, **1** Power Point Presentation Competition, **4** Law Fests. **15** students gave support for research.

More than 38 students drafted well-balanced problems for various intra-college moot and trial competitions.

Senior students and especially senior mooters very enthusiastically encouraged, supported and guided all moot court teams, and judged preliminary rounds of competitions. More than 80 students assisted in co-ordination and organization of all moot court competitions and selections.

The College organized a national-level Professor S P Sathe Memorial National Moot Court Competition in February.

Dr. Deepa Paturkar organised and co-ordinated these activities this year and guided teams participating in all competitions. Smt Ujjwala Sakhalkar organised the international law moots selections and team co-ordination and the Public International Law Competition. Dr. Deepa Paturkar along with Ms. Aishwarya Kadam coordinated the Novices Moot-Court Competition. Dr Tejaswini Malagaonkar coordinated the Negotiation Challenge, Trial Advocacy Moot Court Competition and Counseling competition. Dr. Deepa Paturkar, coordinated the Prof S P Sathe 10<sup>th</sup> Memorial National Moot Court Competition. All teachers very willingly judged competitions and guided ILS teams. Library and administrative staff gave enthusiastic support.

### **Raghavendra Phadnis Moot Court Competition**

The Raghavendra Phadnis Moot Court Competition, 2015 was held over three days in the months of July-August. The preliminary rounds were held on the 27<sup>th</sup> of July 2015. The competition was open to students of the II, III, IV and V BSL LLB and II and III LLB. There were totally 370 odd students who participated. The problems for the preliminary rounds were based on Contract law- drafted by Dr. Nilima Bhadbhade, Tort Law- drafted by Ravalee Nath (IV LLB), Company Law- drafted by Anand Mohan (III LLB), Arbitration- drafted by Deepakar Livingston (Advocate, Bombay High Court). Orientation was given for all the problems to enable first time mooters to gather an idea of the important legal aspects involved in the case. The competition was held in 27 courtrooms spread over two sessions. There were over 40 judges who are all ILS alumni who came down to judge the competition from different places. Two students from each courtroom qualified to the semi-final round. Students in the next three positions qualified as researchers.

The semi-final rounds were held on the 8<sup>th</sup> August 2015. The students argued a problem on constitutional law drafted by Dr. Nilima Bhadbhade and Dr. Deepa Paturkar. This year for the first time compulsory memorial submission was introduced for the semi-final rounds. These memorials accounted for 20 marks and the same was added to the scores of the oral

rounds. These memorials were evaluated by four judges among the eight who came down judge the semi-final rounds. These judges had an exemplary moot record and work experience to their credit. The memorial rounds were introduced with the sole objective of providing the semi-finalists who will soon be representing college in national and international moot court competitions, a learning experience in memorial drafting. Twelve students qualified to the final rounds.

The final rounds were held on 10<sup>th</sup> August 2015. The bench for the Final rounds was constituted by the three such members of the legal fraternity who are known to be doyens of law. It had Mr Anirudha Rajput, who is a practicing advocate at the Supreme Court with some notable moot experience, Mr Ranbir Singh, Advocate, Bombay High Court and Dr. Deepa Paturkar, Assistant Professor, ILS Law College.

The winners of the competition were- Devashish Tiwari (IV LLB), Debopriyo Moulik (V BSL) and Angira Chakravarthy (IV LLB).

The event was organised by a 10 member organising committee who are students of V and IV LLB led by the co-ordinator for Advocacy skills, Dr. Deepa Paturkar. Students of the I BSL LLM and I LLB provided great assistance to the organising committee in pulling off a spectacular event.

### **Selection Round for Public International Law Moots**

#### **Faculty Coordinator:-**

The Public International Law Selection Round 2015-2016 was conducted and Coordinated by Mrs, Ujjwala Sakhalkar, Faculty, ILS Law College, on 16<sup>th</sup> of August 2015. The problem was Stetson International Environmental Moot Court Competition 2015 case problem based on the question relating to cultural property and the protection of elephants. The case involves issues pertaining to International Environmental Law - treaties like CITES, Convention on Biological Diversity, Convention on the Conservation of Migratory Species and other international conferences and declaration and International Criminal Law - the United Nations Convention Against Corruption and the United Nations Convention Against Transnational Organized Crimes.

26 teams had participated from III, IV and V B.S.L- LL.B and II and III LL.B. The competition was judged by Mr. Biswadeep Chakravarty, Advocate, Bombay High Court; Mr. Ajay Sonawane, University of Pune; Ms. Apurva Thakur, Faculty member of I.L.S Law College, Pune and Ms. Priyanka Jawale.

Mr. Shubhanyu Singh, Ms. Aditi Patil and Ms. Shibani Gikhale of V B.S.L LL.B and Ms. Rhea Samyal, Mr. Yash Parihar and Ms. Ammu Shashidharan of III B.S.L LL.B were adjudged as the winners.

### **Novices' Moot Court Competition**

The Novices' Moot Court Competition was organised in three rounds on 16<sup>th</sup>, 23<sup>rd</sup> January 2015 and 25<sup>th</sup> January 2016 for the youngest batch – mooters from I BA LLB and I LLB.

233 students participated in preliminary round in 17 Court rooms on 16th January arguing according to their choice four cases relating to (i) Law of Contract (ii) Law of Tort (iii) Law of Crimes and (iv) Constitutional Law in the preliminary round. Following were the cases for the Preliminary Round. SwarnimaPandit, (III BSL LL.B.), Saurav Roy and IndraneelGodsay (IIB.A.LL.B), RaghuramAruva (V BSL LLB), AayushMritruka and SaurishShetye ( IV BSL.LL.B.) drafted the problems.

All the drafters conducted orientation of the participant, on 21<sup>st</sup> and 22<sup>nd</sup> December 2015 by the drafters of the problems.

The Preliminary Round was judged by the final year students of ILS Law College. A total of 51 judges; 3 in each court room, were invited for the purpose of the competition. Participants finishing 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> in each courtrooms proceeded to the Semi-Finals. Participants qualifying to the Semi-Final Round were handed over the Semi-Final moot proposition, *Robin Carlin Carr. Vs Morgane Broadcast Ltd.*

The orientation for the Semi-Final/Final Round was hosted by Anand Mohan (III LL.B); who had also drafted the moot proposition for the same, along with DevyaniNath (V B.S.L LL.B).The semi-final round held on 23<sup>rd</sup> January 2016 in 4 courtrooms with 51 participants.

The Semi-Final Round was judged by esteemed alumnus of ILS Law College and faculty members from other law colleges in Pune.

Participants finishing 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> from each courtrooms were declared finalists. Following students qualified to the finals of Novice Moot Court Competition 2016

The final round of Novice Moot Court Competition 2016, was held on 25<sup>th</sup> January 2016.

12 participants stood beside the podium with the same moot proposition as the Semi Final Round for the final round of Novice 2016. The judges for the round were Mr. Ameet Deshpande and Ms Suvarna Nilakh, Faculty ILS Law College. They were presented a letter of appreciation, the college book-mark and a Crossword voucher worth Rs. 100 each as a token of gratitude.

#### **5th ILS Intra College Trial Advocacy Competition, 2014**

The 5<sup>th</sup> Intra College Trial Advocacy Competition was held on the 13<sup>th</sup>, 14<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup> December, 2014. The problem was based on Law of Crimes and the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances and was drafted by Shakul Ghatole, Samyuktha Balaji, Senjuti Mallick, Divita Pagey, Disha Jham and Akhilesh Jaiswal. The Competition received an

enthusiastic response from around 150 students, as witnesses, who induced life into the various characters involved in the problem.

Like the previous year, the competition received participation of 48 teams comprising of 192 participants. The preliminary round conducted on 13<sup>th</sup> December, 2014, was judged by various practicing advocates from the Sessions Court, Pune and Mumbai. One team from each of the 8 courtrooms qualified to the semi-finals which were held on 14<sup>th</sup> December, 2014 and further 2 teams qualified to the final round, held on 21<sup>st</sup> December, 2014.

The final round was judged by Hon'ble Mr. Justice B.R.Gavai, Bombay High Court and Mr. Rajesh Tiwari, District and Additional Sessions Judge, Sessions Court, Pune. The team comprising of Manav Gecil Thomas, Meghna Malhotra, Rishabh Malaviya and Tanya Singh were declared as winners. The runners up team comprised of Nikita Panse, Ritwik Kulkarni, Aishwarya Bedekar and Sairuchita Chowdhary. The event was co-ordinated by Dr. Tejaswini S. Malegaonkar.

#### **The 4th Intra-College Negotiation Challenge, 2014**

The 4<sup>th</sup> ILS Intra-College Negotiation Challenge, 2015 was conducted in two rounds on the 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> of September, 2015. A total of 36 teams of two members each, participated in the preliminary rounds. Six second year teams participated in the competition. The competition was coordinated by Dr. Tejaswini Malegaonkar, faculty In-charge for the said event.

**Orientation and Demonstration:** The orientation and demonstration for 'The 4<sup>th</sup> Intra-College Negotiation Challenge, 2015' was held on the 17<sup>th</sup> of August, 2015. The demo session was conducted by two teams, comprising of Hamsini Marada (IV BSL) and Sonali Bhardwaj (V BSL) in one team and Prapti Patel (V BSL) and Saurish Shetye (IV BSL) in the other team. The comprehensive orientation was given by Mr. Ajit Kulkarni, faculty- member, ILS Law College).

**The Preliminary Round:** 36 teams of two members each participated in the preliminary rounds of the competition held on the 5<sup>th</sup> of September 2015 in six conference rooms. Separate sets of a problem and confidential information were created for the preliminary round and the final round by Swarnima Pandit & Prem Bhushan (3<sup>rd</sup> BSL LLB), Hamsini Marada & Yojit Pareek (4<sup>th</sup> BSL LLB) Mohona Thakur & Sonali Bhardwaj (5<sup>th</sup> BSL LLB). Preliminary round was judged by Mr. Rahul Kothari, Mr. Rohan Sarode, Ms. Jesal Shah, Ms. Meenakshi Dubey, Mr. Dilip Gopwani, Mr. Sudhir Reddy, Mr. Krishna Mohan Menon, Mr. Ketan Tadsare, Mr. Ajay Walimbe, Mr. Rohan Ratnaparkhi, Mr. Sachin Kalantre and Mr. Badri Mander. A total of six teams went to the final round.

**The Final Round:** The final rounds of 'The 4<sup>th</sup> ILS Intra-College Negotiation Challenge, 2015' were held on the 6<sup>th</sup> of September, 2015. The judges for this round were Mr. Ganesh Mane, M.D, Bentler Automotives and Mr. Daksh Ahluwalia from Jyoti Sagar Associates.

### **3<sup>rd</sup> ILS Intra College Client Counseling Competition, 2015**

The 3<sup>rd</sup> ILS Intra College Client Counseling Competition was organized in ILS Law College, on 22<sup>nd</sup> and 23<sup>rd</sup> August, 2015. The main focus of the competition was to give a different genre to the law students, converse to the traditional debating and mooting competitions, in the form of a unique competition wherein there is direct communication between the attorneys and the client.

Students from III-V BSL and II-III LLB were eligible to participate as Advocates and students of I – II BSL and I LLB were eligible to participate as Clients. The Orientation for the Competition was conducted by Ms. Ujjawal Sakhalkar faculty at ILS Law College. The Competition was co-ordinated by Dr. Tejaswini Malegaonkar. The Competition witnessed participation from students from all batches in huge numbers with 36 teams (each comprising of 2 members), 48 clients and 15 volunteers, the efforts of each one of them culminated into making the event a huge success. All the problems for the Competition were drafted by Shalini Chandryamuri, Anshul Chopra, Devyani Nath(V BSL LLB), Aayush Mitruka, Akhila Palem, Gokul Thampi(IV BSL LLB), Sang Rakshita, Soham Gosawami(III BSL LLB) and Aditi Vishvanathan(II LLB). The problems were reviewed by Dr. Tejaswini Malegaonkar.

The competition was 3 rounds, Preliminary, Semi-Finals and Finals. The Preliminary rounds comprised of 9 chambers with 4 teams in each chamber. The advocates dealt with issues based on Law of Contracts, Law of Torts and Family law. The Preliminary round was judged by Adv. Vijay Shinde, Adv. Sameer Paranjape, Adv. Sheetal Lokhande, Adv. The highest scoring team from each chamber of Preliminary Rounds advanced to the Semi-Finals which had 3 chambers, each consisting of 3 teams. The problem for the Semi-Finals was based on Criminal Law. It was judged by Adv. Harshvardhan Salgaonkar, Adv. Abhijeet Bhasme, Adv. Shailendra Aglawe, Adv. Rishikesh Ganu, Adv. Ankita Sarkar and Adv. Ranjit Sinh Pawar. The team with the highest score from each chamber qualified for the final showdown.
