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
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Why ILS




Our Roots

The Indian Law Society's Law College dates back as far as the year 1902, when Mr. J.R. Gharpure and Mr. P.B. Singhe decided to make a new beginning in the direction of a regularized system of imparting legal education. 'The New Law Class, Bombay' was therefore started in 1903. After running this class for five years, it was thought desirable to start a regular law college, which would be affiliated to a university. Accordingly, the Fergusson College Law Class was started in 1908, and was conducted by Mr. Gharpure. More than 125 students were registered on roll. However within a few weeks, this institution was disaffiliated from the University of Bombay. After a period of more than fifteen years the above experiment was still under trial. The scope for improvement was recognised and on 4th March, 1923, a new society called the 'Indian Law Society' was inaugurated, whose first President was Dr. Sir Narayan Rao C. Chandawarkar. It was proposed at this meeting that a private law college be set up in Pune. After preliminary preparations, the Law college formally commenced operation on the 20th of June 1924, under the banner of the Indian Law Society. It was then known as the 'Poona Law College'. The Society acquired 200 acres of land and the first building called the Saraswati Building was built in 1935. The foundation stone was laid down at the hands of the Late Honourable Srinivas Shastri on 7th January 1935.

The Saraswati building was thoughtfully architectured to look like a sage meditating in the 'lotus' position. Subsequently the hostel for resident students, a Gymkhana and a pavilion were also built. The construction of a swimming pool further enriched the facilities. The Laxmi building was later added to meet the growing needs of the College. All this was done under the auspices of the first principal of the college, Nana Saheb Gharpure - a man of great vision & foresight.



The Campus

Situated at the foot of the Law College hill, the college has a calm and picturesque surrounding encompassing a spacious 154 acres of land. Nature has endowed the campus with a unique aesthetic quality that helps to maintain a congenial environment for study and reflection.

The College facilities combine stately architecture and state-of-the-art resources. The campus stretches from the Saraswati Building which houses the library, the administrative office, the conference hall and the Principal's office, besides the chambers of other faculty members and computer facilities for research students, to the Laxmi Building that houses over seventeen halls for regular lectures, the legal aid centre and an auditorium with a capacity of 400 people, used for guest lectures, college functions and presentations.

Apart from the academic and administrative buildings, the College facilities are further enriched with a huge residential complex for male students; the newly constructed Ladies Hostel, a gymnasium, a sprawling cricket and football ground, a sports









pavilion housing the indoor sports facilities, tennis courts and a swimming pool. With all this and more the College facilities are unmatched by any other institution for legal studies in the country.

ILS Law College is located in the academic hub of the city, with renowned institutions like the Bhandarkar Oriental Research Institute, Symbiosis Institute, SNDT University and Fergusson College just a stones throw away. It is also not very far from the Savitribai Phule Pune University.

The College stands facing the Law College Road, which links Senapati Bapat Road and Karve Road, both leading to important commercial as well as educational zones like Deccan Gymkhana and the University Circle.

The college campus is 8 kms. from the Railway Station and 16 kms. from the Airport. So, if you are at ILS Law College, you can be rest assured to experience law in a congenial environment compounded with an amiable atmosphere.

Principal Gharpure Library

Introduction:

The Principal Gharpure Library is one of the best Law Libraries in Asia. The total collection of the library as of March 2024 comprises 58507 books and 13060 bound volumes of periodicals. The total addition to the collection from 1st Apr 2023 – 31 March 2024 is 1275, which includes 1144 books and 130 bound volumes. The total number of periodicals subscribed are 56, out of which 40 are legal and socio-legal whereas 16 are general in nature.

The collection of the library reflects a rich and classic collection of old and rare books since its inception. The rare books collection consists of more than 500 publications dating from 1824 till 1950. This collection also has costly books, which are valued assets of any library. The special collection includes more than 183 books costing beyond the range of 10000 rupees.

The rare books also consist of some rare manuscripts by legal luminaries like Justice M. G. Ranade. Doctoral thesis of Legal Stalwarts like Professor Dr. S. P. Sathe is one of the price collections. The library has automated with SLIM21 software updated version 3.9.0 (2022)

Students are allowed to issue **Two Books** for the period of **Eight days** from the library by producing a library borrower card at the issue counter.

Remote Access Platform – MYLOFT (My Library on Fingertips):

MYLOFT provides seamless access to online databases to all teachers and students. It is a mobile web app platform that allows users to discover-access-organize-share, econtent of their personal and professional interests.

Library Website: The library website is updated regularly with the addition of new information. It is made accessible through the college website (https://ilslaw.edu/library/) to the students and faculty members for searching the collection of library i.e. books, e-books, e-journals, and legal databases, e shod Sindhu and Shodhganga etc.

Computer Facility: The Library has 57 computers and 9 Laptops for students, which provide access to well-known Indian legal databases.

Internet and Wi-Fi Facility: Dedicated 100 MBPS lease line ensures faster internet connectivity. All computers and laptops are working in LAN (Local Area Network) environment. Laxmi Building, all 3 floors of Saraswati building, Boys as well as the Girls' Hostel have been Wi-Fi enabled, and this facilitates students' access to the subscribed databases through their laptops much beyond the regular library hours.

Electronic surveillance system CCTV:

To prevent theft and mutilation of books, an Electronic Surveillance System is available in the library.

User Tracking System:

User Tracking Systems is incorporated with Library Management System, (Kiosk) for recording users' (faculties and students) visits to the library. It will help with generating reports daily, weekly, and monthly.

ILS Digital Repository:

The library on occasion of the centenary year, created an Institutional Repository for ILS on 30th January 2023.





ILS Law College Special Highlights

- 1. Centenary Year Inauguration 2023-2024: Indian Law Society's ILS Law College entered its centenary year in June 2023, a proud moment in the history of ILS Law College. The inauguration of the centenary celebrations commenced on 18th June 2023 at the hands of Hon. Justice Bhushan Gavai (Judge, Supreme Court, India) and the ceremony was presided over by Justice Mridula Bhatkar, President, Indian Law Society. Hon'ble Justice Bhushan Gavai unveiled the new college centenary logo along with Justice Mrudula Bhatkar, Advocate Prakash Karandikar, Ms. Vaijayanti Joshi, and Prof (Dr.) Deepa Paturkar.
- 2. Remembering Prof S P Sathe Event: Remembering Prof S. P. Sathe is an annual event consisting of Public Memorial Lecture, Conference and Moot Court on a specific theme of law with a view to commemorate Late Prof S.P. Sathe contribution to Indian Jurisprudence and Social Action and to encourage academic pursuit of law students. On the occasion of the centenary year, an international conference on Law and Culture: Interplay between, Law, Culture, Society and Politics under the auspices of SP Sathe Foundation. Prof S P Sathe 18th Public Memorial Lecture,2024 was delivered by Prof. (Dr.) Faizan Mustafa, Vice Chancellor, Chanakya National Law University, Patna on the topic "Religious and Cultural Diversity, Constitution and the Law".

3. ILS Legal AID cell: - The ILS Legal Aid centre was established in 1976. The centre has been consistently receiving grants. In 2019 the ILS Legal Aid Centre received grant from Maharashtra State Legal Services Authority. The Centre is devoted to dispensing free legal advice and makes attempts to settle disputes amicably. It also provides legal assistance to the economically underprivileged if needed. The Centre in Collaboration with NGOs such as Deep Griha, Kagad Kach Patra Kashtakari Panchayat and Karve Institute, organizes various legal aid / legal literacy camps to create awareness among people about their legal rights and duties under various legislations, thereby helping the marginalized sections of the society to have access to justice. The Legal Aid center works under the guidance of a teacher-in-charge who is assisted by other full time faculty members. The Centre works 6 days a week and inculcates in the students a sense of social responsibility. The Centre also undertakes publication of legal literacy materials on various legal issues like environment, succession, jurisdiction of various courts, etc.

The Legal Aid Centre strives to ingrain a commitment to pro bono service in each student, encouraging them to participate in the program providing legal services to the weaker sections of the society. Such an activity gives them an opportunity to practice and expand the legal skills acquired in the classroom while providing much needed assistance to underprivileged members of the community.

The Post Graduate students are encouraged to participate in the legal aid activities of the College.

Their participation includes in the form of organizing and conducting street plays, preparing legal literacy material delivering lectures on socio-legal issues.

4. Ph.D. Research Centre - ILS Law College Ph.D. Research Centre established in 2016 regulates admissions of Ph.D. research scholars as per the rules of SPPU. Presently 19 students are registered for Ph.D. with the Centre.

ILS Law College Special Highlights

- 5. In house Publication at ILS Law College- ILS Law Review and Abhivyakti Law Journal are an in-house publication of the ILS Law College providing a platform to the students to research, write and authenticate their research findings through publication. ILS law review is dedicated to Prof S P Sathe conference proceedings. The proceedings are published in the form of articles contributed by speakers of the conference and participants. On the centenary year inauguration ceremony, Volumes 13,15 and 16 of ILS Law Review were released at the hands of Justice Gavai, Judge, Supreme Court of India.
- 6. Advocacy Skills Activities include Moot Courts, Trials, Client Counseling, Alternative Dispute Resolution, Drafting, Judgment Writing Deliberation, Treaty Appreciation, Paper Presentation, Bill Analysis Competition, Parliamentary Debate, Group Discussion, Essay Competitions and Quizzes, and Law Fests. On Occasion of the centenary year an international moot court competition was organized on the theme 'Law and Culture" with a specific focus on the broader issue of "International Human Rights Violations of the Indigenous People." 30 teams representing various law colleges across India and abroad participated in the competition.
- 7. Diploma and Certificate Programme: Online Autonomous Certificate programs are conducted by the Indian Law Society to enable the participants to understand the practical aspects of procedural laws. Several courses were designed such as Criminal Law: Practice and Procedure; Law of Civil Procedure for Civil Trials and Appeals; Energy Law of India etc.
- 8. Cells and Centre at ILS Law College: Various Cells and Centers at ILS Law College is a student –teacher initiative dedicated to research, discussions and publication and conducting of conference/Seminars on specific subjects of law. It keeps the student updated with the development in the law as well as encouraging the students to undertake research and suggest amendments to the law. The cells and centers include Center for Public Law, Centre for Commercial Laws, Center for International Law, Center for Technology,

- Ip and Media Laws; Gender Studies Cell, Hariyali Environment Law Cell, Criminal Law Cell, Human Rights Cell, Debating Society, Competitive Exam Cell.
- 9. ILS Cultural Department: The ILS Cultural Department is one of the versatile departments with incredible success. Various cultural activities and dramas are conducted with great enthusiasm. Students are provided training from direction and acting to the subtle nuances in the philosophy of theatre through workshops.
- 10. ILS Debating Society and Marathi Vad Sabha: ILS promotes debate and discussion on the campus through the ILS Debating Society and Marathi Vad Sabha. The society undertakes and oversees various debating activities in college including parliamentary debates, conventional debates, informal discussions, and Model United Nations conferences. The Justice V.M. Tarkunde Parliamentary Debate, currently in its 12th Edition, is the flagship annual parliamentary debate of society. Marathi Vad Sabha is an open platform for the students where they can express themselves without any language barrier. It undertakes activities such as discussion, debating, elocution and writing on the topics of current relevance. Both the platforms encourage the students to discuss their views and develop their oratory skills.

SISTER INSTITUTES

• Institute of Advanced Legal Studies (IALS): The Institute of Advanced Legal Studies was established in 1991 to promote research in law and to conduct courses on different laws, helpful to society in general. The target audience for these courses were principally the common man. These courses are designed to create a distinct and quality legal culture amongst the Indian community, thereby complementing and supporting the efforts of ILS Law College in promoting quality legal education. IALS has been consistently and regularly conducting intensive shot term diploma and certificate courses programs. Mrs. Sathya Narayan is the Honorary Director of the Institute of Advanced Legal Studies.

ILS Law College Special Highlights

- The ILS Centre for Arbitration and Mediation (ILSCA) was established in 2016 by the Indian Law Society. The Centre is headed by Ms. Sathya Narayan, who is the Director of ILSCA. The primary aim of establishing ILSCA is to provide facilities for ad-hoc arbitration and institutional arbitrations, in domestic as well as international spheres. Along with the institutional set up, ILSCA provides training through workshops, training programs and courses to members of the legal fraternity and students of law who have an interest in arbitration and mediation.
- Centre for Mental Health Law & Policy (CMHLP): The Centre for Mental Health Law & Policy (CMHLP) was founded in 2006 to strengthen and transform the mental health of our communities. CMHLP collaborate with stakeholders from multiple disciplines including policymakers, mental health professionals, researchers, civil society organizations to promote evidence-based policy reform and evaluate innovative & sustainable real-life solutions to improve mental health, suicide prevention, and social

- outcomes. CMHLP also offers various training and courses to promote a shift in knowledge, attitudes, and practice towards mental health for all.
- Centre for Health Equity, Law & Policy (C-HELP)
 Established by the Indian Law Society, C-HELP uses the law as a tool for health transformation, embedding its work in the right to health as envisaged within India's constitutional framework and her international commitments. It advocates for equity and justice in health through generation, sharing and use of knowledge that informs related law and policy.
- ILS Centre for Training for Good Governance: Indian Law Society has established "ILS Centre for Training for Good Governance" on 7th July 2022 to train government officers, semi-government officers, NGOs and other stakeholders who are implementing the relevant laws and procedures. The Centre became operational with the inauguration of training program of the officers of the Town Planning and Valuation Directorate, Government of Maharashtra as its first program.


The Principal Pandit Lecture Series

Residential Accommodation

One of the main concerns for a prospective university student, coming from outside the city of Pune, is the availability of accommodation. The students of ILS Law College enjoy an advantage as, apart from the college hostel for both male and female students, there are a large number of hostels, paying-guest accommodations and student apartments available within a 3 KM radius of the



college.

ILS GENTS' HOSTEL

The Indian Law Society provides accommodation for male students of the college, at the Hostel, which is situated in the campus. Such accommodation is provided strictly on the basis of merit. The hostel offers a total of 154





rooms out of which 46 are double rooms and 108 are single occupancy rooms. The administration of the hostel

is taken care of by the Rectors.

The Hostel has three wings. It is flanked by tennis court on one side and overlooks the picturesque Law College Hill on the other. Ample parking space is also available for the vehicles of residents and visitors.

ILS LADIES' HOSTEL

Although Pune is a safe city and its extremely low crime rate boasts of this fact, the College believes that a hostel within the premises will provide greater security to the female students, who come to Pune from



various parts of India and aborad. Recognizing their need the Society commenced the construction of the ILS Ladies Hostel in the year 2001 and completed it in June 2002. The Hostel was ready for occupation by July 2002 and became functional since then. It provides the basic furniture including a bed, chair, table and cupboard. There is a Dining Hall, Study Room, and Sick Room and Telephone facilities. Recreational facilities also are provided.

Due to continuous increase in number of girl students at ILS Law College, a New Ladies' hostel has been constructed in 2019 and is ready for occupation. It provides accommodation to 140 students. The hostel is spacious situated in the beautiful, lush green campus of the College. The rooms are spacious and each room has an attached toilet-bath, bed, chair, cupboard, and table.

There is a dining hall, sit out place, sick room, internet facility and solar system is also provided.

Note: ILS Ladies Hostel accommodation is subject to availability.

Annual charges for Ladies' Hostel (including food) are as follows:

Rs. 1,85,000/- Old Ladies' Hostel

Rs. 2,35,000/- New Ladies' Hostel

Annual charges for Gents' Hostel (excluding food) are as follows:*

Single occupancy Room Rs. 70,000/-

Double occupancy Room Rs. 55,000/- per person

* Revised rate of fees will be displayed at the time of admission

MEDICAL FACILITIES

A medical officer is available to students twice a week in the Medical Room of the hostel. In case of emergencies, the medical officer can be contacted through the Rectors. First aid box are provided at administrative office, faculty room, library, gymkhana and hostels.

OTHER FACILITIES

The student is provided with basic furniture in the room which includes a study table, a chair and a bed. Hot water is available 24 hours a day. Water coolers, to provide safe drinking water, are present in each wing. STD / ISD facility is available in the campus. The college also has a Dining Hall for meals and a Canteen. Outside caterers also supply meals at nominal rates to the students.

INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS' CELL

The International Students' Cell was established in the academic year 2008-09 to provide a single window system to help international students. The Cell receives foreign students under the Student Exchange Programme and assists the aspirant students in obtaining information regarding eligibility, fee structure, courses offered, accommodation, etc. The College gets students from Bhutan, Nepal, Kenya, UAE, etc. The Cell aims to undertake faculty and student exchange programmes, research projects, organize expert lecture series etc.



Admission Rules

ELIGIBILITY:

Every candidate seeking admission to D.T.L., D.L.L. & L.W. must be graduate from any recognized university.

- 1. Admission to DTL and DLL & LW Programme is online.
- 2. The duly completed admission forms must accompany all relevant documents i.e. mark sheets, certificates etc. Those desirous of getting admission in any of the reserved categories must provide supporting documents at the time of submission of forms, failing which the application will be considered for open category.
- 3. The Interviews will be conducted offline. The schedule for the interview will be displayed on the college website. The student is required to bring all the original documents along with a set of xerox copies for admission. Prof Santosh Jaybhay the Programme- in- charge will verify the documents.
- 4. Students are required to pay fees on the same day immediately after the interview.
- 5. All certificates submitted by the candidates of reserved category must be issued by the competent authority. Non creamy layer certificates must be issued by sub-divisional officer and be valid up to 31 March 2025.
- 6. Students seeking admission in any Programme must submit mark sheets of S.S.C. or equivalent, H.S.C. or equivalent and graduation marksheet along with passing certificate.
- 7. Applicants who have obtained 10+2 or graduation/post graduation through open university system directly without having any basic qualification for pursuing such studies are not eligible for admission in law courses.
- 8. International Students:

All admissions for international students are made through the International Students Centre, Savitribai Phule Pune University. For further details visit

Instructions Related to Payment of Fees

- All fees are subject to change as per the University of Pune rules.
- ii) Backward Class students have to submit their scholarship / freeship form at the time of admission only and if not submitted, full fee has to be paid at the time of admission. The amount credited to student's account includes the share of college which is not paid by student. This amount has to be paid by student immediately to college when credited. This fee will be refunded to them on receipt of their scholarship/ freeship from Government.
- iii) I For the amount of Tuition Fees to be paid by different categories of students, please refer Pune University Circular No. Law/2002/365 dated 30-10-2002.
 - I. Notwithstanding anything provided otherwise, the Tuition fee and Laboratory fee are prescribed for the students from the State of Maharashtra. The tuition fee (* See note) for the students who are from outside the State of Maharashtra will have to pay double the Tuition Fee and Non-resident Indian students, persons of Indian origin, Foreign Citizens / Foreign Nationals will have to pay three times the fees that is prescribed for the State of Maharashtra. The students from Bhutan, Nepal and Srilanka will pay two times the fees as prescribed.
- iv) For the definition of 'Candidates from outside Maharashtra' please refer Pune University circular No. 39 of 2010, relevant extract from which is given below: Pune University order dated 30-10-2002.
 For 'Maharashtra State Candidate', 'Maharashtra Domiciled Candidate' and 'Candidate from Outside

- Maharashtra State', please refer University of Pune Circular no. 39 of 2010 as follows:
- v) a) Maharashtra State Candidate : means a candidate passing SSC (Std. X) and higher education thereafter from the State of Maharashtra.
 - b) Maharashtra Domiciled Candidate: means a candidate should be domiciled of the State of Maharashtra.
- vi) a) Candidate from Outside Maharashtra State: means a candidate whose domicile status is outside Maharashtra and has passed his qualifying examination from University outside Maharashtra. He will be eligible for admission as candidate from outside Maharashtra.
 - b) A candidate whose domicile status is Outside Maharashtra State, but who has passed his qualifying examination from a statutory University in the State of Maharashtra, but has passed his SSC or its equivalent examination from a recognized school outside the State of Maharashtra, will be eligible for admission to an institution which lies in the jurisdiction of the University. He will be considered as candidate from Outside Maharashtra State.
 - c) A candidate whose domicile status is Outside Maharashtra and who has passed his/her qualifying examination from Pune University but has passed his/her SSC or equivalent examination from outside Maharashtra State, while filling in the application form for admission he/she should indicate their domicile status as "Other than Maharashtra".

Refund of Fees on cancellation of admission as per University Rules:

If a student chooses to withdraw from the programme of study in which he is enrolled, the college/institution concerned shall follow the following five-tier system for the refund of fees remitted by the students. A full refund of fees is applicable for all cancellation of admissions upto 30th Sept'24 and with a deduction of not more than Rs 1000/- upto 31st Oct'24

Instructions related to Payment of Fees:

- 1) Payment of fees is online only.
- 2) Below mentioned are steps to be followed for making payments of fees online-
 - **Step I:** Payment window opens with options SBI Internet Banking / Other Banks Internet Banking / Credit Cards. Select any one option and fill in the required details according to the nature of transaction.

They will be admitted to the college only if they produce letter of admission issued by the Savitribai Phule Pune University.

Diploma in Taxation Laws (D.T.L.)

Faculty Incharge: Dr. Santosh Jaybhay

Eligibility

Eligibility for admission requires the candidate to be a graduate of any faculty of any University whose degree is recognized to be equivalent to the corresponding degrees of Pune University.

Duration

The duration of this Programme shall be one academic year.

Examination

The examination is held at the end of the academic year on dates announced by the University. The Programme consists of five papers, each of hundred marks.

Standard and grades of passing

The candidate has to secure a minimum of 35% marks in each subject and an aggregate of 50% to pass in second class. A Candidate securing 60% or above aggregate would be declared to have passed in First class, and one securing 75% or above shall be declared to have obtained a distinction.

Course Description

The syllabus of Diploma in Taxation Laws has been changed from academic year 2018-19. The Savitribai Phule Pune University has updated the syllabus considering the changes in the law relating to Goods and Services Tax. The syllabus will include following papers:

Paper I - General Laws affecting Taxation

This course is designated to provide an overview of Taxation laws from the other fields of law such as Constitution, Hindu Law, Indian Partnership Act, Transfer of Property Act, Evidence Act, Civil Procedure Code, Indian Trust Act, and Indian Succession Act. It is a mix of the freedom of trade and commerce, Mitakshara concepts, Intestate and Testamentary succession concepts

of immovable property, trust and trustees and execution of wills.

Paper II - Income Tax Act A & B

This course is intended to provide an in-depth understanding of the Law relating to Income tax through the study of the Indian Income Tax Act, 1961 as amended up-to-date. Emphasis is given on solving Practical Problems and case Studies. Part B includes Banking cash Transactions Act 2005.

Paper III – The Integrated Goods and Services Tax Act 2017 (GST)

The Course provides an in- depth and a comprehensive study of GST Act, which provides for a single domestic indirect tax law for the entire country. The Course also includes other laws having a direct bearing on GST such as the Central Goods and Service Tax Act, 2017, Union Territory Goods and Service Tax Act, 2017, The Goods and Service Tax Act, 2017.

Paper IV – The Customs Act, 1962

The Customs Act, 1962 introduces the students to the basic concepts of Custom Law, valuation, assessment of imported and Export Goods and Procedural aspects and rate of customs duty applicable.

Paper V - Book Keeping and Accountancy

To complement the other subjects, this is a basic course on the principles of accountancy. It starts with the fundamentals like double entry book keeping, Bills, types of accounts like Manufacturing and Profit and Loss account, Balance Sheet followed by Partnership accounts, consignments and joint ventures, company accounts and valuation of Depreciation and Goodwill.

Diploma in Labour Law and Labour Welfare (D.L.L. & L.W.)

Eligibility

Graduate of any faculty of any university whose degree is recognized to be equivalent to the corresponding degrees of Pune University.

Duration

Duration of this Programme shall be one academic year.

Examination and Standard of Passing

The candidate has to secure a minimum of 35% marks in each paper and an aggregate of 50%. A candidate securing 60% or above will be declared to have passed in First Class and above 75% will obtain a distinction.

Programme of Study

The Programme of study leading to Diploma in Labour Laws and Labour Welfare consists of the following compulsory papers:

Paper I

Laws relating to Labour Management Relations

It includes the Trade Union Act, 1926, the Industrial Employment (Standing) Orders Act, 1946, the Bombay Industrial Relations Act, 1946, the Industrial Disputes Act, 1947 and the Prevention of Unfair Labour Practices Act, 1971.

Paper II

Social Security Legislations

The syllabus includes the Workmen's Compensation Act, 1923, the Employees State Insurance Act, 1948, the Employees Provident Funds and Miscellaneous Provisions

Act, 1952, the Bombay Labour Welfare Fund Act, 1953, the Maternity Benefit Act, 1961 and the Payment of Gratuity Act, 1972.

Paper III

Principles of Wage Fixation and Law of Wages

This paper covers the Principles of fixation of Wage and Bonus and the relevant statutes such as the Payment of Wages Act, 1936, the Minimum Wages Act, 1948, the Payment of Bonus Act, 1965 and the Equal Remuneration Act, 1976.

Paper IV

Legislations Affecting conditions of work

This paper deals with legislative measures adopted to ensure proper healthy conditions of work and include the Factories Act, 1948, the Bombay Shops and Establishment Act, 1948, Mines Act, 1952, Motor Transport Workers Act, 1961, the Contract Labour Act, 1970, Child Labour (Prohibition and Regulation) Act, 1986 and Bonded Labour System (Abolition) Act, 1776.

Paper V

Practical Training

This includes field work and study Tour Reports and viva-voce. Visits include factory / industry, Labour / Industrial Court and the Offices of various labour departments of the government, such as Office of Labour Commissioner, Office of Director, Safety and Health and Office of the Regional Commissioner of Provident Fund. Visit to Trade Union Office or Labour Welfare Centre also are part of the visits.

Instructions to Students

- 1. Admission form must be completed in all respects including certificates and documents as indicated below. Incomplete forms will not be considered for Admission. Scanned copies of necessary documents (in appropriate and readable size) mentioned below must be uploaded while submitting online application form.
- 2. Students must appraise themselves of all the rules and procedure of admission as stated in the prospectus. Any changes made thereafter will be updated on the college website at www.ilslaw.edu. The time-table and procedure for admission can also be seen on the college website.
- 3. Students must carry with them additional copies of photographs for I card purpose and submit self Attested true copies of the following documents and must produce the originals at the time of interviews / admission.
 - i. Statement of Marks of S.S.C. or equivalent & H.S.C. or equivalent examination.
 - ii. Graduation mark sheet along with post graduation mark sheet if any.
 - iii. Where grade system is followed in assessment, student shall also give transcripts of marks in percentage along with the formula to convert the grade points into percentage.)
 - iv. Passing certificate
 - v. For the purpose of date of Birth Certified copy of entry in birth register, or school leaving certificate, or certificate of SSC or equivalent examination
 - vi. A student who has completed neither SSC nor HSC (or equivalent exams) from a recognised institution in Maharashtra, but who himself/herself or whose father or mother is domiciled in the State of Maharashtra must produce a domicile certificate of a Competent Authority that he/she/father/mother is domiciled in the State of Maharashtra; else such student will be treated as a Candidate from Outside Maharashtra for the purposes of admission and fees.
 - vii. A student coming from a college affiliated to Savitribai Phule Pune University must produce a transfer certificate from that college. A students coming from any other University must produce Migration Certificate from that University. In case a student in unable to produce the Transfer certificate/Migration certificate, the student will be required to give an undertaking that the same will be produced within 15days.
 - viii. If a student seeks admission and other benefits (fees, concessions etc.) in categories reserved for backward classes and other backward classes:
 - a) Caste certificate issued by competent authority b) In the case of sub-categories among VJNT, NT(C), NT (D) to whom the creamy-layer criteria is applicable, a valid and subsisting certificate from the appropriate authority that the student does not belong to the creamy Layer. In case a student is unable to produce the non-ceramy layer certificate, the student will be required to give an under taking that the same will be produced within 15 days. c) Caste Validity certificate for students claiming admission in the reserved category.

IF SUCH CERTIFICATES ARE NOT SUBMITTED WITH THE ADMISSION FORM, THE STUDENT WILL BE CONSIDERED FOR ADMISSION IN THE OPEN CATEGORY FOR ALL PURPOSES INCLUDING ADMISSION, MERIT LIST AND FEES.
