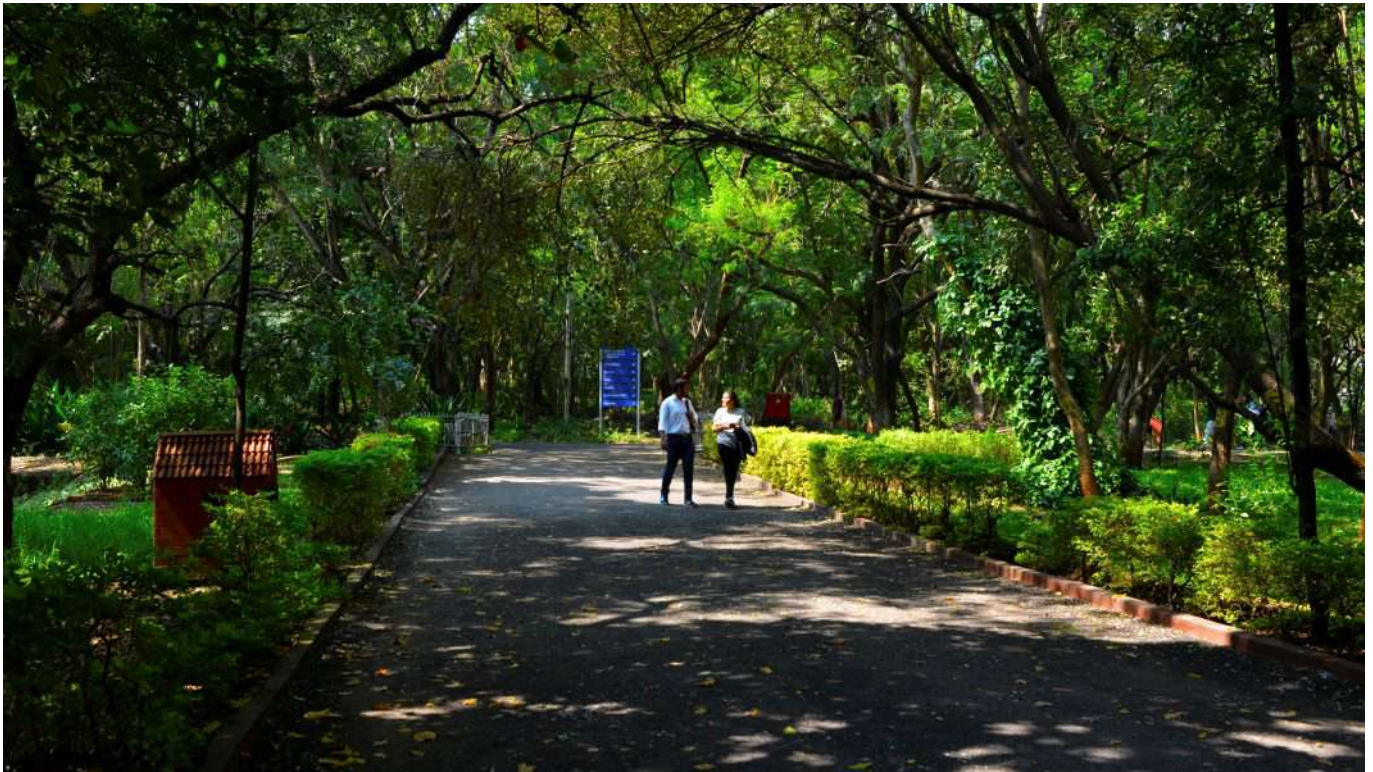

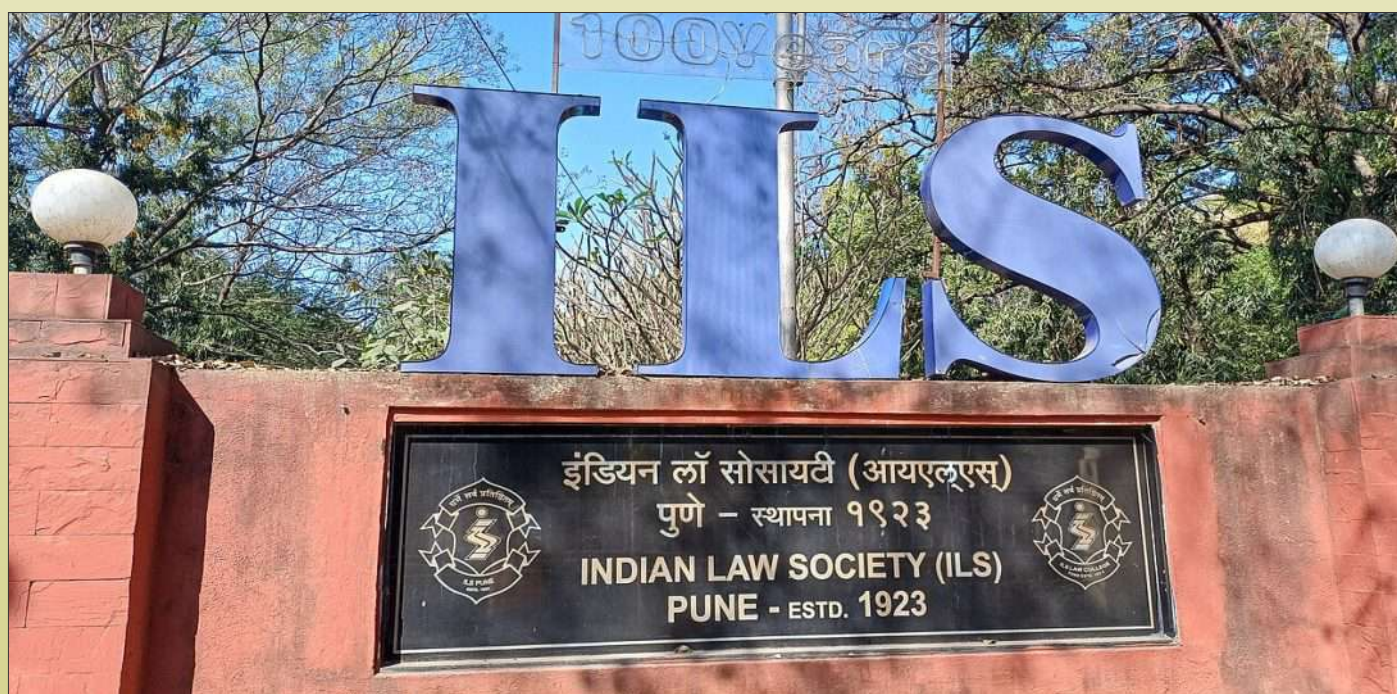

Our Roots

The Indian Law Society's Law College dates back as far as the year 1902, when Mr. J.R. Gharpure and Mr. P.B. Shingane decided to make a new beginning in the direction of a regularized system of imparting legal education. 'The New Law Class, Bombay' was therefore started in 1903. After running this class for five years, it was thought desirable to start a regular law college, which would be affiliated to a university. Accordingly, the Fergusson College Law Class was started in 1908, and was conducted by Mr. Gharpure. More than 125 students were registered on roll. However within a few weeks, this institution was disaffiliated from the University of Bombay. After a period of more than fifteen years the above experiment was still under trial. The scope for improvement was recognised and on 4th March, 1923, a new society called the 'Indian Law Society' was inaugurated, whose first President was Dr. Sir Narayan Rao C. Chandawarkar. It was proposed at this meeting that a private law college be set up in Pune. After preliminary preparations, the Law college formally commenced operation on the 20th of June 1924, under the banner of the Indian Law Society. It was then known as the 'Poona Law College'. The Society acquired 200 acres of land and the first building called the Saraswati Building was built in 1935. The foundation stone was laid down at the hands of the Late Honourable Srinivas Shastri on 7th January 1935.

The Saraswati building was thoughtfully architected to look like a sage meditating in the 'lotus' position. Subsequently the hostel for resident students, a Gymkhana and a pavilion were also built. The construction of a swimming pool further enriched the facilities. The Laxmi building was later added to meet the growing needs of the College. All this was done under the auspices of the first principal of the college, Nana Saheb Gharpure - a man of great vision & foresight.

The Campus

Situated at the foot of the Law College hill, the college has a calm and picturesque surrounding encompassing a spacious 154 acres of land. The Campus is home to a rich diversity of flora and fauna. Nature has endowed the campus with a unique aesthetic quality that helps to maintain a congenial environment for study and reflection.

The College facilities combine stately architecture and state-of-the-art resources. The campus stretches from the Saraswati Building which houses the library, the administrative office, the conference hall and the Principal's office, besides the chambers of other faculty members and computer facilities for research students, to the Laxmi Building that houses over seventeen halls for regular lectures, the legal aid centre and an auditorium with a capacity of 400 people, used for guest lectures, college functions and presentations.

Apart from the academic and administrative buildings, the College facilities are further enriched with a huge residential complex for male students; the newly constructed Ladies Hostel, a sprawling cricket



and football ground, a sports pavilion housing the indoor sports facilities, tennis courts and a swimming pool. With all this and more the College facilities are unmatched by any other institution for legal studies in the country.

ILS Law College is located in the academic hub of the city, with renowned institutions like the Bhandarkar Oriental Research Institute, Symbiosis Institute, SNTD University and Fergusson College just a stones throw away. It is also not very far from the Savitribai Phule Pune University.

The College stands facing the Law College Road, which links Senapati Bapat Road and Karve Road, both leading to important commercial as well as educational zones like Deccan Gymkhana and the University Circle.

So, if you are at ILS Law College, you can be rest assured to experience law in a congenial environment compounded with an amiable atmosphere.

Principal Gharpure Library

The Principal Gharpure Library is one of the best law libraries in India with a rich and classic collection of old and rare books since its inception. The rare books collection consists of more than 500 publications dating from 1824 onward till 1950. The rare books also consist of some rare manuscripts by legal luminaries like Justice M. G. Ranade and doctoral thesis of Legal Stalwarts like Professor Dr. S. P. Sathe is one of the priceless collections.

The total collection of the library as of March 2025 comprises 59850 books and 13219 bound volumes of periodicals. Apart from this, the college has subscribed to various Online Databases such as Lexis Advance, Hein Online, SCC Online, AIR Online, INFLIBNET / N-LIST, LiveLaw, West Law etc. The library also has a collection of diverse literature. These comprehensive resources enable students to conduct advanced research, helping them to write well-informed papers, thesis, and projects using credible sources. The library has also created an Institutional Digital Repository for ILS.

The library is accessible and ensures that all students can access resources effectively. This includes offering a "reader on request" service, where library staff or volunteers assist the students with disabilities in finding, retrieving, and reading materials. This can be particularly helpful for individuals with visual impairments, learning disabilities, or physical limitations that make handling books or reading difficult.

The students may access the above mentioned digital resources through-

1. Library website (<https://ilslaw.edu/library/>)
2. Remote access platform-MYLOFT(My library on Fingertips)
3. Computer Facility available in the library
4. Internet and Wi-Fi Facilities available in the college.

Rules of Library:

1. Timings: 9.30 am to 9.00 pm on all working days.
2. Library Membership and Circulation Policies: All registered students of the institute are entitled to membership of the library. Refundable deposit of Rs 1000/- is payable to college as per SPPU rules towards Library membership.

Students can avail Home lending facility by payment of Rs 1600/- out of which Rs 1000/- is refundable at the end of the year.

3. No. of Books that can be issued: Students are allowed to issue Two Books for the period of Eight days from the library by producing a library borrower card at the issue counter.
4. Electronic surveillance system- CCTV: To prevent theft and mutilation of books, an Electronic Surveillance System is available in the library.

ILS Law College : Activities of the Academic Year 2024-2025

1. Remembering Prof S P Sathe Event: Remembering Prof S. P. Sathe is an annual event consisting of Public Memorial Lecture, Conference and Moot Court on a specific theme of law with a view to commemorate Late Prof S.P. Sathe's contribution to Indian Jurisprudence and Social Action and to encourage academic pursuit of law students. For 2024–25, the theme was “Empowering Governance and Justice through Artificial Intelligence: Balancing Innovation with Accountability” to highlight the evolving relationship between technology and the legal system. Prof S P Sathe 19th Public Memorial Lecture, 2025 was delivered by Justice Dr. Dhananjaya Chandrachud, Former Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of India on the topic “Eliminating the Non-Player Character Energy in the Indian Judiciary”.
2. ILS Legal AID cell: - The ILS Legal Aid centre was established in 1976. Over the past 48 years, the Centre has continually expanded its initiatives and outreach, working with unwavering dedication and enthusiasm. Actively collaborating with a range of stakeholders—including the District Legal Services Authority (DLSA), Karve Institute of Social Services, community leaders, schools, colleges, and village panchayats- the Centre continues to play a pivotal role in promoting legal awareness and access to justice at the

grassroots level. The Centre is devoted to dispensing free legal advice and makes attempts to settle disputes amicably. The Legal Aid centre works under the guidance of a teacher-in-charge who is assisted by other full time faculty members. The Centre works 6 days a week and inculcates in the students a sense of social responsibility. The Centre also undertakes publication of legal literacy materials on various legal issues like environment, succession, jurisdiction of various courts, etc. The Legal Aid Centre strives to ingrain a commitment to pro bono service in each student, encouraging them to participate in the program providing legal services to the weaker sections of the society. Such an activity gives them an opportunity to practice and expand the legal skills acquired in the classroom while providing much needed assistance to underprivileged members of the community.

The Post Graduate students are encouraged to participate in the legal aid activities of the College. Their participation includes in the form of organizing and conducting street plays, preparing legal literacy material and delivering lectures on socio-legal issues.

3. Ph.D. Research Centre - ILS Law College Ph.D. Research Centre established in 2015 regulates admissions of Ph.D. research scholars as per the rules of SPPU. Presently 11 students are registered for Ph.D. with the Centre. 13 students are selected for the Ph.D. Program in 2024.
4. In-house Publication at ILS Law College- ILS Law Review and Abhivyakti Law Journal are the in-house publication of the ILS Law College providing a platform to the students to research, write and authenticate their research findings through publication. In the Abhivyakti Law Journal a section is dedicated to publication by the Post Graduate (LL.M) Students. The ILS Law Review is dedicated to Prof S P Sathe conference proceedings. The proceedings are published in the form of articles contributed by speakers of the conference and participants.

5. Advocacy Skills Activities include Moot Courts, Trials, Client Counseling, Alternative Dispute Resolution, Drafting, Judgment Writing Deliberation, Paper Presentations, Bill Analysis Competition, Parliamentary Debate, Group Discussion, Essay Competitions, Quizzes, and Law Fests. Students of ILS Law College have brought laurels to the institution through these co-curricular activities.
6. Diploma and Certificate Course: Online Autonomous Certificate programs are conducted by the Indian Law Society to enable the participants to understand the practical aspects of procedural laws. Several courses were designed such as Criminal Law: Practice and Procedure; Law of Civil Procedure for Civil Trials and Appeals; Human Rights etc.
7. Cells and Centre at ILS Law College: Various Cells and Centers at ILS Law College is a student –teacher initiative dedicated to research, discussions and publication and conducting of Conferences or Seminars on specific subjects of law. It keeps the student updated with the development in the law as well as encouraging the students to undertake research and suggest amendments to the law. The cells and centers include Center for Public Law, Centre for Commercial Laws, Center for International Law, Center for Technology, IP and Media Laws, Gender Studies Cell, Hariyali – Environment Law Cell, Criminal Law Cell, Human Rights Cell, Debating Society, Competitive Exam Cell, ILS Marathi Vaad Sabha, ILS Legal History Cell etc.
8. ILS Cultural Department: The ILS Cultural Department is one of the versatile departments with incredible success. Various cultural activities and dramas are conducted with great enthusiasm. Students are provided training to direct and act in dramas, street plays and to the subtle nuances in the philosophy of theatre through workshops.
9. ILS Debating Society and ILS Marathi Vad Sabha: ILS promotes debate and discussion on the campus through the ILS Debating Society and Marathi Vad Sabha. The society undertakes and oversees various debating activities in college including parliamentary

debates, conventional debates, informal discussions, and Model United Nations conferences. The Justice V.M. Tarkunde Parliamentary Debate, currently in its 13th Edition, is the flagship annual parliamentary debate of the society. Marathi Vad Sabha is an open platform for the students where they can express themselves without any language barrier. Both the platforms encourage the students to discuss their views and develop their oratory skills.

10. ILS Law College organizes alumni meet every year on 25th December. This year, the theme was “ILS ke Kalamkar” celebrating the achievements of our esteemed alumni who have authored or edited a book.

SISTER INSTITUTES of Indian Law Society

Institute of Advanced Legal Studies (IALS): The Institute of Advanced Legal Studies was established in 1991 by Prof Dr S.P.Sathe to promote research in law and to conduct courses on different laws, helpful to society in general. The target audience for these courses were principally the common man. These courses are designed to create a distinct and quality legal culture amongst the Indian community, thereby complementing and supporting the efforts of ILS Law College in promoting quality legal education. IALS has been consistently and regularly conducting intensive short term diploma and certificate courses. Ms. Sathya Narayan is the Honorary Director of the Institute of Advanced Legal Studies.

Centre for Mental Health Law & Policy (CMHLP): The Centre for Mental Health Law & Policy (CMHLP) was founded in 2006 to strengthen and transform the mental health of our communities. Residential Accommodation

Hostel Facilities at ILS Law College

ILS Law College offers secure and comfortable hostel accommodation for both male and female students within its lush, green campus located in the heart of Pune. This on-campus location minimizes travel time and provides students with easy access to essential amenities such as the library, mess, sports facilities, and study spaces allowing them to focus on their



academic and career goals.

The ILS Hostels are maintained by the Indian Law Society for the benefit of the students of ILS Law College. The administration of the hostel is entrusted to the Rector of the Hostel.

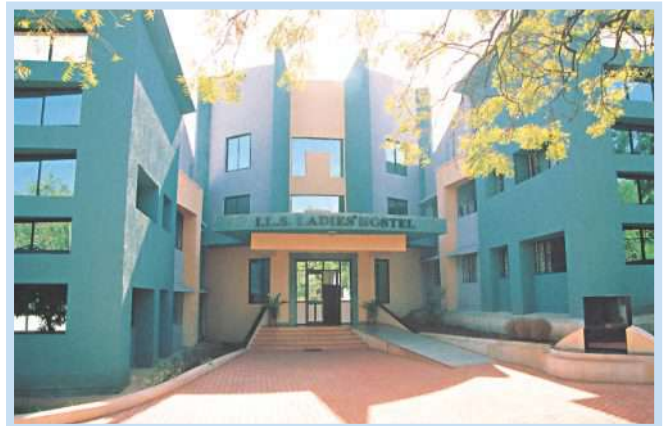
The **Gents' Hostel** accommodates students strictly on a merit basis and includes 154 rooms (108 single



and 46 double occupancy), spread across three wings. It offers basic furniture, hot water, purified drinking water, parking, and recreational areas.

The **Ladies' Hostel** consists of two buildings: One with houses 2 seater and 3 seater rooms with Common Washrooms. Second houses only 2 seater rooms with attached washrooms. Together, they house around 220 students and offer secure accommodation with study furniture, and common facilities like dining halls, study rooms, and recreational spaces.

Both hostels benefit from on-campus medical support, including regular visits by a medical officer and emergency care access..

Admission Rules

ELIGIBILITY :

Every candidate seeking admission to D.T.L., D.L.L. & L.W. must be graduate from any recognized university.

1. Admission to DTL and DLL & LW Programme is online.
2. The duly completed admission forms must accompany all relevant documents i.e. mark sheets, certificates etc. Those desirous of getting admission in any of the reserved categories must provide supporting documents at the time of submission of forms, failing which the application will be considered for open category.
3. The Interviews will be conducted offline. **The schedule for the interview will be displayed on the college website.** The student is required to bring all the original documents along with a set of xerox copies for admission
4. Students are required to pay fees on the same day immediately after the interview.
5. All certificates submitted by the candidates of reserved category must be issued by the competent authority. Non creamy layer certificates must be issued by sub-divisional officer and be valid up to 31 March 2026.
6. Students seeking admission in any Programme must submit mark sheets of S.S.C. or equivalent, H.S.C. or equivalent and graduation marksheet along with passing certificate.
7. Applicants who have obtained 10+2 or graduation/post graduation through open university system directly without having any basic qualification for pursuing such studies are not eligible for admission in law courses.
8. International Students:

All admissions for international students are made through the International Students Centre, Savitribai Phule Pune University.

Instructions Related to Payment of Fees

- i) All fees are subject to change as per the University of Pune rules.
- ii) Backward Class students have to submit their scholarship / freeship form at the time of admission only and if not submitted, full fee has to be paid at the time of admission. The amount credited to student's account includes the share of college which is not paid by student. This amount has to be paid by student immediately to college when credited. This fee will be refunded to them on receipt of their scholarship/ freeship from Government.
- iii) For the amount of Tuition Fees to be paid by different categories of students, please refer Pune University Circular No. Law/2002/365 dated 30-10-2002.
Notwithstanding anything provided otherwise, the Tuition fee and Laboratory fee are prescribed for the students from the State of Maharashtra. The tuition fee (* See note) for the students who are from outside the State of Maharashtra will have to pay double the Tuition Fee and Non-resident Indian students, persons of Indian origin, Foreign Citizens / Foreign Nationals will have to pay three times the fees that is prescribed for the State of Maharashtra. The students from Bhutan, Nepal and Srilanka will pay two times the fees as prescribed.
- iv) For the definition of 'Candidates from outside Maharashtra' please refer Pune University circular No. 39 of 2010, relevant extract from which is given below :
Pune University order dated 30-10-2002.
For 'Maharashtra State Candidate', 'Maharashtra Domiciled Candidate' and 'Candidate from Outside Maharashtra State', please refer University of Pune Circular no. 39 of 2010 as follows:

- v) a) Maharashtra State Candidate : means a candidate passing SSC (Std. X) and higher education thereafter from the State of Maharashtra.
- b) Maharashtra Domiciled Candidate : means a candidate should be domiciled of the State of Maharashtra.
- vi) a) Candidate from Outside Maharashtra State : means a candidate whose domicile status is outside Maharashtra and has passed his qualifying examination from University outside Maharashtra. He will be eligible for admission as candidate from outside Maharashtra.
- b) A candidate whose domicile status is Outside Maharashtra State, but who has passed his qualifying examination from a statutory University in the State of Maharashtra, but has passed his SSC or its equivalent examination from a recognized school outside the State of Maharashtra, will be eligible for admission to an institution which lies in the jurisdiction of the University. He will be considered as candidate from Outside Maharashtra State.
- c) A candidate whose domicile status is Outside Maharashtra and who has passed his/her qualifying examination from Pune University but has passed his/her SSC or equivalent examination from outside Maharashtra State, while filling in the application form for admission he/she should indicate their domicile status as "Other than Maharashtra".

Refund of Fees on cancellation of admission as per University Rules :

If a student chooses to withdraw from the programme of study in which he is enrolled, the college/institution concerned shall follow the following five-tier system for the refund of fees remitted by the students. A full refund of fees is applicable for all cancellation of admissions upto 30th Sept'25 and with a deduction of not more than Rs 1000/- upto 31st Oct'25

9. Foreign students desirous of securing admission to this college should contact the International Students Cell at the Savitribai Phule Pune University for obtaining letter of admission from them. They will be admitted to the college only if they produce letter of admission issued by the Savitribai Phule Pune University.

10. The college follows the government policy and guidelines for reservation while allocating seats.

Diploma in Taxation Laws (D.T.L.)

Eligibility

Eligibility for admission requires the candidate to be a graduate of any faculty of any University whose degree is recognized to be equivalent to the corresponding degrees of Pune University.

Duration

The duration of this Programme shall be one academic year.

Examination

The examination is held at the end of the academic year on dates announced by the University. The Programme consists of five papers, each of hundred marks.

Standard and grades of passing

The candidate has to secure a minimum of 35% marks in each subject and an aggregate of 50% to pass in second class. A Candidate securing 60% or above aggregate would be declared to have passed in First class, and one securing 75% or above shall be declared to have obtained a distinction.

Course Description

The syllabus of Diploma in Taxation Laws has been changed from academic year 2018-19. The Savitribai Phule Pune University has updated the syllabus considering the changes in the law relating to Goods and Services Tax. The syllabus will include following papers :

Paper I - General Laws affecting Taxation

This course is designated to provide an overview of Taxation laws from the other fields of law such as Constitution, Hindu Law, Indian Partnership Act, Transfer of Property Act, Evidence Act, Civil Procedure Code, Indian Trust Act, and Indian Succession Act. It is a mix of the freedom of trade and commerce, Mitakshara concepts, Intestate and Testamentary succession concepts of immovable property, trust and trustees and execution of wills.

Paper II - Income Tax Act A & B

This course is intended to provide an in-depth understanding of the Law relating to Income tax through the study of the Indian Income Tax Act, 1961 as amended up-to-date. Emphasis is given on solving Practical Problems and case Studies. Part B includes Banking cash Transactions Act 2005.

Paper III – The Integrated Goods and Services Tax Act 2017 (G ST)

The Course provides an in- depth and a comprehensive study of GST Act , which provides for a single domestic indirect tax law for the entire country. The Course also includes other laws having a direct bearing on GST such as the Central Goods and Service Tax Act, 2017, Union Territory Goods and Service Tax Act, 2017, The Goods and Service Tax Act, 2017.

Paper IV – The Customs Act, 1962

The Customs Act, 1962 introduces the students to the basic concepts of Custom Law, valuation, assessment of imported and Export Goods and Procedural aspects and rate of customs duty applicable.

Paper V - Book Keeping and Accountancy

To complement the other subjects, this is a basic course on the principles of accountancy. It starts with the fundamentals like double entry book keeping, Bills, types of accounts like Manufacturing and Profit and Loss account, Balance Sheet followed by Partnership accounts, consignments and joint ventures, company accounts and valuation of Depreciation and Goodwill.

Diploma in Labour Law and Labour Welfare (D.L.L. & L.W.)

Eligibility

Graduate of any faculty of any university whose degree is recognized to be equivalent to the corresponding degrees of Pune University.

Duration

Duration of this Programme shall be one academic year.

Examination and Standard of Passing

The candidate has to secure a minimum of 35% marks in each paper and an aggregate of 50%. A candidate securing 60% or above will be declared to have passed in First Class and above 75% will obtain a distinction.

Programme of Study

The Programme of study leading to Diploma in Labour Laws and Labour Welfare consists of the following compulsory papers :

Paper I

Laws relating to Labour Management Relations

It includes the Trade Union Act, 1926, the Industrial Employment (Standing) Orders Act, 1946, the Bombay Industrial Relations Act, 1946, the Industrial Disputes Act, 1947 and the Prevention of Unfair Labour Practices Act, 1971.

Paper II

Social Security Legislations

The syllabus includes the Workmen's Compensation Act, 1923, the Employees State Insurance Act, 1948, the Employees Provident Funds and Miscellaneous Provisions

Act, 1952, the Bombay Labour Welfare Fund Act, 1953, the Maternity Benefit Act, 1961 and the Payment of Gratuity Act, 1972.

Paper III

Principles of Wage Fixation and Law of Wages

This paper covers the Principles of fixation of Wage and Bonus and the relevant statutes such as the Payment of Wages Act, 1936, the Minimum Wages Act, 1948, the Payment of Bonus Act, 1965 and the Equal Remuneration Act, 1976.

Paper IV

Legislations Affecting conditions of work

This paper deals with legislative measures adopted to ensure proper healthy conditions of work and include the Factories Act, 1948, the Bombay Shops and Establishment Act, 1948, Mines Act, 1952, Motor Transport Workers Act, 1961, the Contract Labour Act, 1970, Child Labour (Prohibition and Regulation) Act, 1986 and Bonded Labour System (Abolition) Act, 1776.

Paper V

Practical Training

This includes field work and study Tour Reports and viva-voce. Visits include factory / industry, Labour / Industrial Court and the Offices of various labour departments of the government, such as Office of Labour Commissioner, Office of Director, Safety and Health and Office of the Regional Commissioner of Provident Fund. Visit to Trade Union Office or Labour Welfare Centre also are part of the visits.

Instructions to Students

1. Admission form must be completed in all respects including certificates and documents as indicated below. Incomplete forms will not be considered for Admission. Scanned copies of necessary documents (in appropriate and readable size) mentioned below must be uploaded while submitting online application form.
2. Students must appraise themselves of all the rules and procedure of admission as stated in the prospectus. Any changes made thereafter will be updated on the college website at www.ilslaw.edu. The time-table and procedure for admission can also be seen on the college website.
3. Students must carry with them additional copies of photographs for I card purpose and submit self Attested true copies of the following documents and must produce the originals at the time of interviews / admission.
 - i. Statement of Marks of S.S.C. or equivalent & H.S.C. or equivalent examination.
 - ii. Graduation mark sheet along with post graduation mark sheet if any.
 - iii. Where grade system is followed in assessment, student shall also give transcripts of marks in percentage along with the formula to convert the grade points into percentage.)
 - iv. Passing certificate
 - v. For the purpose of date of Birth - Certified copy of entry in birth - register, or school leaving certificate, or certificate of SSC or equivalent examination
 - vi. A student who has completed neither SSC nor HSC (or equivalent exams) from a recognised institution in Maharashtra, but who himself/herself or whose father or mother is domiciled in the State of Maharashtra must produce a domicile certificate of a Competent Authority that he/she/father/mother is domiciled in the State of Maharashtra; else such student will be treated as a Candidate from Outside Maharashtra for the purposes of admission and fees.
 - vii. A student coming from a college affiliated to Savitribai Phule Pune University must produce a transfer certificate from that college. A students coming from any other University must produce Migration Certificate from that University. In case a student in unable to produce the Transfer certificate/Migration certificate , the student will be required to give an undertaking that the same will be produced within 15days.
 - viii. If a student seeks admission and other benefits (fees, concessions etc.) in categories reserved for backward classes and other backward classes :
 - a) Caste certificate issued by competent authority
 - b) In the case of sub-categories among VJNT, NT(C), NT (D) to whom the creamy-layer criteria is applicable, a valid and subsisting certificate from the appropriate authority that the student does not belong to the creamy Layer. In case a student is unable to produce the non-creamy layer certificate, the student will be required to give an under taking that the same will be produced within 15 days.
 - c) Caste Validity certificate for students claiming admission in the reserved category.

IF SUCH CERTIFICATES ARE NOT SUBMITTED WITH THE ADMISSION FORM, THE STUDENT WILL BE CONSIDERED FOR ADMISSION IN THE OPEN CATEGORY FOR ALL PURPOSES INCLUDING ADMISSION, MERIT LIST AND FEES.

Undertakings

- i) I hereby undertake, if admitted to attend the classes as per the rules of Savitribai Phule Pune University.
- ii) I hereby submit to the disciplinary jurisdiction of the authorities of the University / and the authorities of the College, and shall observe and abide by the rules made by them.
- iii) I understand that if admitted, my admission will be confirmed only on production of the Transfer Certificate / Migration Certificate from previous College or educational institution and the Final Eligibility Certificate of the Savitribai Phule Pune University.
